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## No. 152.

### AN ACT

To authorize the guardians of the minor children of Henry Irwin, deceased, to convey certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the guardians of the minor children of Henry Irwin, deceased, are hereby authorized to release and convey to the purchaser or purchasers at sheriff's sale, of the lots hereinafter described, the undivided interest, late the estate of John Irwin, deceased, in two certain lots in the city of Pittsburg, one thereof being the undivided moiety of lot number forty-three, in Wood's plan of the city of Pittsburg, bounded by Penn-street, by Barker alley, by lot number forty-four, and by the Allegheny river, being sixty feet in front on Penn-street, and extending in depth to the Allegheny river, on which are erected a double frame dwelling-house and other buildings; the other, being the undivided moiety of lot number one hundred and eighty-nine, in Wood's plan of the said city, bounded by Water-street, by lot number one hundred and eighty-eight, by Front-street, and by lot number one hundred and ninety, being sixty feet in front on Water-street, more or less, and extending

in depth one hundred and sixty feet, more or less, to Front-street, on which are erected a two story log dwelling-house and other buildings. And the said release and conveyance shall be sufficient to vest in the said purchaser or purchasers of said lots the right, title and interest, late of John Irwin, deceased, as fully and perfectly as if the sale and conveyance to the minor children of Henry Irwin had never been made: *And provided further*, That the release by the said guardians to the said purchaser or purchasers shall be approved of by the court of Common Pleas of Dauphin county: *And provided further*, That an acknowledgment of the said release before the mayor of the city of Baltimore, or one of the judges resident in said city, shall be a sufficient acknowledgment of such release or conveyance, and shall entitle the same to be recorded in the county of Allegheny in this Commonwealth.

## No. 153.

### AN ACT

For the relief of sundry soldiers and widows of revolutionary soldiers.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to James Cupples of Mifflin county, John Patridge of Beaver county, Dewalt Linn of Northumberland county, James Irwin of Franklin county, Samuel Wilson of Fayette county, Henry Hortendorf, John Baker and Michael Reiley of York county, soldiers of the revolution, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars to each during life, to be paid half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four.

SECTION 2. The State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Elizabeth Madera and Ann Maria Witman of Berks county, and Elizabeth Bough of Lancaster county, the widows of revolutionary soldiers, or to their respective orders,
