AN ACT

For the relief of sundry soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Jacob Feree and Michael Clapsadle of Adams county, Philip Mick of Dauphin county, Francis Burns of York county, Nathan B. Jennings of Schuylkill county, and John Crutcher of Chester county, or to their respective orders each forty dollars, immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four.

AN ACT

To authorize the Governor to incorporate the president, managers and company of the Butler and Freeport Turnpike road company.
