A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the Acts of Assembly relating to auctions in the city of Lancaster and other towns in this Commonwealth.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the provisions of the act of assembly, of the seventh of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, entitled "An Act regulating auctions in the city of Lancaster, and other towns in this commonwealth," and the provisions of the act of Assembly, of the sixth of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, entitled "A supplement to the act regulating auctions in the city of Lancaster, and other towns of this commonwealth," passed on the seventh day of April, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, be, and the same are hereby extended to the borough of Reading, in the county of Berks.

SECTION 2. That the provisions of the act passed the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, entitled "An Act regulating auctions in the city of Lancaster, and other towns in this commonwealth," be and the same are hereby extended to the county of Fayette, except the last proviso contained in the fourth section of the said act.

SECTION 3. That the fourth section of the act, entitled "A further supplement to the several acts of the general assembly, respecting auctions and auctioneers," passed the twenty-ninth day of March, eighteen hundred and twenty-four, shall not be so construed as to prevent auctioneers in the city of Philadelphia, from selling goods, wares, merchandize or commodities, at the stores, warehouses, wharves or yards of the owners, factors or other persons having charge of the same, any thing in said section to the contrary notwithstanding.
