

SECTION 6. That the commissioners of the county of
 Coms of M'- M'Kean are hereby authorized to borrow a sum or sums of
 Kean co money for the purpose of erecting and constructing county
 buildings, not exceeding altogether the sum of twenty thousand
 dollars, at an interest not exceeding six per cent. per annum,
 upon such terms as to security and time of payment as may
 be by them agreed on; and all moneys so loaned shall be ex-
 pended for the purposes aforesaid, under the direction of the
 judges of the court of common pleas of said county.

AN ACT

To authorize the Governor to incorporate the president, managers and
 company of the Buckingham and Doylestown Turnpike Road com-
 pany, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of
 Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in
 General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the
 authority of the same,* That Thomas P. Broadhurst, Thom-
 as Paxson, William Stanley, Samuel Brown, Joseph Broad-
 hurst, Samuel Eastburn, William Moore, Samuel Yardly,
 John H. Anderson, E. T. M'Dowell, Charles H. Mathews,
 William Beans, James Burson, John Ruckman, Hugh B.
 Ely, Jacob Eastburn, John Blackfan, Matthias Shaw, Alex-
 ander C. Brittain, Jonas Fell, Edward Williams, James Kirk,
 James Simpson, Valentine Dickerson, Samuel A. Smith of
 Buckingham, Anthony Rich, Charles Smith, William T.
 Rogers, Samuel D. Ingham, James Pool, Joseph Campbell,
 Charles Cope, Stryker Everett, and Stephen Brock, of the

county of Bucks, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners, with full power and authority to do and perform the same duties for the company to be incorporated by the provisions of this act, that the commissioners are authorized to do and perform for "the Doylestown and Danborough turnpike road company;" and the said company shall be known by the name, style or title of the "Buckingham and Doylestown turnpike road company."

SECTION 2. That the said road shall commence at the Buckingham meeting house, and shall be made on the bed of the state road leading from the meeting house aforesaid, to the junction of York and State streets in the borough of Doylestown, thence by the most practicable route to the eastern and Philadelphia road in said borough, except where it may be necessary to widen, straighten, or to avoid hills, et cetera, on said route: *Provided*, That said road shall first be completed between said meeting house and Yardley's mill; and all the provisions, powers and authorities, granted or to be granted under the provisions of the act incorporating the Doylestown and Danborough turnpike road company, under like limitations and restrictions, are hereby extended to the Doylestown and Buckingham turnpike road company: *Provided further*, That the duties prescribed to be done and performed by the commissioners in said act, shall be done and performed by the commissioners named in this act, on the same days and times therein provided.

SECTION 3. That so soon as the legislature of Ohio shall pass a concurrent law, J. B. Curtis, Thomas Irvin and Joseph Budd, be commissioners on the part of the state of Pennsylvania, to locate a road commencing at or near the farm of Elam Bently, in the township of Brookfield, Trumbull county, state of Ohio, thence along the line dividing said county Pa to states, until it intersect a road leading from New Bedford, in Mercer county, to Lowell, in Trumbull county, Ohio, at a point upon the farm of William T. Smith, in Mahoning township, Mercer county, said road to be fifty feet in width, and the expense of opening and keeping the said road in repair, shall be paid by the townships through which it may pass, the citizens of Pennsylvania bearing one-half of said expense; and a return of the survey and location of said road shall be made out, one copy whereof shall be forwarded to the secretary of this commonwealth, and one copy deposited in the office of the clerk of the court of quarter sessions in the county of Mercer; the said commissioners shall be paid one dollar and fifty cents per day from the treasury of the county of Mercer, and one-half the necessary expense of chain carriers, et cetera, shall also be paid from said treasu-

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ry; and said commissioners shall make return of said survey, with the courses and distances, within six months from the date of such concurrent law being passed by the state of Ohio.

AN ACT

Authorizing the executors of Putnam Catlin, late of the county of Susquehanna, deceased, to sell and convey certain real estate, and for other purposes.

Proviso

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Francis P. Catlin and Charles Dimon, executors named in the last will and testament of Putnam Catlin, late of the county of Susquehanna, deceased, or either of them in the absence of the other from the state, be and they are hereby authorized to execute deeds, in fee simple, to the purchaser or purchasers, their heirs or assigns, of all lands sold, or contracted to be sold, by the said Putnam Catlin, in his life time, for which deeds have not already been made; and that they, or either of them in the absence of the other as aforesaid, or in case of the inability or refusal of either of them to act, or to perform the duties of executor as aforesaid, be and are also hereby authorized and empowered to sell, either at public or private sale, as shall be deemed most advantageous to the estate, all or any part of the lands of the said decedent remaining undisposed of, and convey the same to the purchaser or purchasers thereof, their heirs or assigns, by deed or otherwise, in fee simple: Provided, That before entering upon the several duties herein prescribed,*
