AN ACT

To incorporate the Staffordshire Coal and Iron company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Charles Miner, Jesse Thomas, and Stephen Fuller Abbott, or a majority of them, and their associates, successors and assigns, be and they are hereby created and constituted a body corporate and politic, by the name, style and title of the "Staffordshire coal and iron company," the capital stock of which company shall not exceed two hundred thousand dollars; and the said company may hold not exceeding three thousand acres of land at any one time, in the counties of Columbia and Luzerne; and the company shall have the same powers, liberties, franchises and immunities, and be subject to the same terms and conditions as are imposed on the "Anthracite iron company," passed the twenty-fifth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine: *Provided,* That the company hereby created shall be restricted to the use of anthracite coal, in carrying on their operations; and they are hereby authorized to employ such portion of their capital as may be necessary in mining coal, constructing railroads, and in transporting to market, and in vending the produce of the lands, mines and manufactures, and in dealing in such articles of personal property as may be necessary to enable them successfully to carry on their operations.
