Notice to be given of the time & place of organizing the company. *ly* may be after said letters patent shall be sealed and obtained, shall give notice in two of the newspapers printed in Philadelphia, and one printed at Williamsport in Lycoming county, of a time and place by them to be appointed, not less than thirty days from the publication of the first notice, at which time and place the said subscribers shall proceed to organize the said corporation, and shall choose, by a majority of votes of the said subscribers, by ballot, to be delivered in person or by proxy duly authorised, one president and twelve managers, one treasurer and such other officers as they shall think necessary to conduct the business of the said company for one year and until such other officers shall be chosen; and the said managers so chosen, and their successors, shall and may make such by-laws, rules, orders and regulations, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this state or of the United States, as shall be necessary for the well ordering the affairs of the said company; and generally have like powers, authorities and privileges necessary for carrying on and completing the said turnpike road, and be subject to all the duties, qualifications, restrictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures, and be entitled to like tolls and profits, in proportion to the distance, as are given and granted to the president, managers and company of the Easton and Wilkesbarre turnpike road: *Provided*, That if the said company shall not proceed to carry on the said work in four years after the passing of this act, or shall not within ten years afterwards complete the said road, according to the true intent and meaning of this act, then and in either of these cases, it shall and may be lawful for the legislature of this commonwealth to resume all and singular the rights, privileges, liberties and franchises by this act granted to the said company.

What officers to be chosen.

To enjoy like powers and be subject to like restrictions to that of the Easton and Wilkesbarre turnpike company.

CHAPTER LXII.

A SUPPLEMENT to the act, entitled "An act to authorise the governor to incorporate a company to erect a toll bridge over Big Beaver creek, at or near Wolf lanc, in the county of Beaver."

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the present site of the bridge which has been erected over Big*

Beaver creek, near Wolf lane, be, and the same is hereby confirmed as fully and to all intents and purposes, as if the said site had been fixed in the act to which this is a supplement.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the president, managers and company for erecting the bridge aforesaid, be, and they are hereby authorised to erect a toll-house a toll-house on the west bank of Big Beaver creek, and that two perches in length, on each side of said bridge, of the public land adjoining said creek, be, and the same is hereby vested in said president, managers and company, to be run off by the deputy surveyor of Beaver county, two perches in length and two in breadth, adjoining said bridge, for the purpose aforesaid, as long as the same shall be necessary for such toll-house, or until resumed by the legislature.

CHAPTER LXIII.

An ACT making further provision for the support of the Board of Wardens for the port of Philadelphia.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That if upon a settlement of the accounts relative to the warden's office, and the expenses necessarily incurred in conducting the business thereof, it shall appear that the monies received by the master warden, in any one year after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, shall not have been sufficient to pay the said expenses, it shall be lawful for the auditor general to draw a warrant or warrants upon the state treasurer, in the usual manner, for the amount of such deficiency, which shall be paid out of any money in the treasury: *Provided,* That the same shall not, in any one year, exceed the sum of two thousand dollars in the whole.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act, the compensation to be paid to the master warden for the time being, shall be three dollars for every day which he shall necessarily attend at the warden's office, and no more.
