AN ACT

Requiring recorders of deeds to note releases of mortgages on the margin of the record of such mortgages.

Recorders of deeds.

Release of mortgage to be noted on record.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That hereafter it shall be the duty of the recorders of deeds of the several counties to enter upon the margin of the record of any mortgage the book and page wherein any release of such mortgage, or part thereof, is recorded, together with the date of such release.

AN ACT

To amend section one of article one of the act, approved the second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred seventy-six), entitled "An act to provide for the health and safety of persons employed in and about the anthracite coal mines of Pennsylvania and for the protection and preservation of property connected therewith," by extending the provisions of the act to all anthracite mines or collieries that employ five or more persons, and authorizing the mine inspectors to enter and inspect all mines employing from two to five persons for the purpose of determining whether or not the mine is generally safe.

Anthracite coal mines.

Section 1, act of June 2, 1891 (P. L. 176), amended.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section one of article one of the act, approved the second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred seventy-six), entitled "An act to provide for the health and safety of persons employed in and about the anthracite coal mines of Pennsylvania and for the protection and preservation of property connected therewith," is hereby amended to read as follows:

Application of act.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That this act shall apply to every anthracite coal mine or colliery in the Commonwealth [provided the said mine or colliery] that employs five or more [than ten (10)] persons: *Provided, however, The inspector shall have the right to enter and inspect all mines employing from two to five persons for the purpose of determining whether or not the mine is generally safe.*

Inspection of mines employing two to five persons.
