

of such persons as are qualified to vote as herein provided. Two weeks' notice of the registration days shall be given, by the registrars posting notices at the polling-places. Electors who did not register at Fall registration may register at Spring registration, or at any special registration, and the list shall become of no validity at the beginning of the period of Fall registration next succeeding that at which the registers were opened. The old registers shall be preserved by the county commissioners for at least two years after the year in which they shall have been in use.

AN ACT

To reenact section one, and to amend section six, of the act, approved the thirteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred nineteen), entitled "An act for the promotion of medical science by the distribution and use of unclaimed human bodies for scientific purposes, through a board created for that purpose, and to prevent unauthorized uses and traffic in human bodies," as amended, by reestablishing the Anatomical Board of the State of Pennsylvania, and making the board self-sustaining.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section one of the act, approved the thirteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred nineteen), entitled "An act for the promotion of medical science by the distribution and use of unclaimed human bodies for scientific purposes, through a board created for that purpose, and to prevent unauthorized uses and traffic in human bodies," as amended by section one of the act approved the fourteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen (Pamphlet Laws, five hundred six), is hereby reenacted to read as follows:

Section 1. The professors of anatomy, the professors of surgery, the demonstrators of anatomy and the demonstrators of surgery, of the medical and dental schools and colleges of this Commonwealth, which are now or may hereafter become incorporated, together with one representative from each of the unincorporated schools of anatomy or practical surgery within this Commonwealth, in which there are, or, from time to time, at the time of the appointment of such representatives, shall be, not less than five scholars, shall be and hereby are constituted a board for the distribution and delivery of dead human bodies, hereinafter described, to and among

Organization of board.	such persons as, under the provisions of this act, are entitled thereto. The professor of anatomy in the University of Pennsylvania, at Philadelphia, shall call a meeting of said board for organization, at a time and place to be fixed by him, within thirty days after the passage of this act. The said board shall have full power to establish rules and regulations for its government, and to appoint and remove proper officers, and shall keep
Minutes.	full and complete minutes of its transactions; and records shall also be kept, under its direction, of all bodies received and distributed by said board, and of the persons to whom the same may be distributed, which minutes and records shall be open at all times to the inspection of each member of said board and of any district attorney of any county within this Commonwealth. The
Record.	name of said board of distribution shall be—Anatomical Board of the State of Pennsylvania.
Name of board.	Section 2. That section 6 of said act, as amended by the act approved the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one (Pamphlet Laws, three hundred sixteen), is hereby further amended to read as follows:
Section 6, as amended by act of June 1, 1931 (P. L. 316), further amended.	Section 6. <i>Neither the Commonwealth nor any</i> [No] county or municipality, nor any officer, agent or servant thereof, shall be at any expense by reason of the delivery or distribution of any such body, but all the expenses thereof and of said board of distribution shall be paid [from a State appropriation to be made biennially for such purposes.] <i>by those receiving the bodies.</i> On the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and quarterly thereafter, it shall be the duty of the board to ascertain its full operating cost during the preceding three months, and to bill each school, college, physician, or surgeon for such sum, per cadaver furnished, as will equal such cost, except that the sum per cadaver shall never exceed twenty dollars. All moneys received or collected by the board under this act shall be [paid into the State Treasury, through the Department of Revenue. Upon the effective date of this act, the board shall pay into the State Treasury, through the Department of Revenue, any unexpended and unencumbered balance of moneys in the possession of the board which were heretofore collected or received by the board under this act.] <i>used by the board for the payment of all expenses incurred in the performance of its duties under this act.</i>
