Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section five of the Department of act, approved the fourteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five (Pamphlet Laws, two hundred thirty-four), entitled "An act relating to boarding houses for infants; providing for the licensing thereof and the adoption of rules and regulations for the mainand the adoption of rules and regulations for the main-tenance, operation, and conduct thereof, by the Depart- L. 234). ment of Welfare; and fixing penalties," is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 5. Issuance of License.—The Department of Welfare shall, when satisfied that the applicant or applicants for such license are proper persons and that the place sought to be used as a boarding house for infants is a fit and suitable place for such purpose, and when all the requirements of this act and the rules and regulations of the department have been complied with, and upon the payment of a license fee of five dollars (\$5.00), issue such license and keep a record thereof and of the application therefor.

Section 2. That section six of said act is hereby section 6

amended to read as follows:

Term and Contents of License.—All li-Section 6. censes granted by the department shall be for a period of not more than one year, and may be renewed upon the payment of an annual fee of five dollars (\$5.00). The license shall state the name of the licensee or licensees. the particular premises where such boarding house may be maintained, operated, and conducted, and the number of infants which may be boarded therein at one time. All license fees collected and received by the Department of Welfare under the provisions of this act shall be paid into the State Treasury, through the Department of Revenue.

Section 3. This act shall become effective upon the when effective. date of its final enactment.
