

time of the occurrence of said cause domiciled without this Commonwealth, and that the respondent has been served with the subpoena only by publication, as provided by this act.

All petitions or libels for divorce shall be exhibited to the court of the county where [the libellant resides, except where the husband and wife shall be resident in different counties of this Commonwealth, and, while so resident, a cause of divorce shall arise, in which cases the libellant may, at his or her option, institute and prosecute proceedings either in the county of his or her own residence or in the county wherein the respondent shall be resident and the cause for divorce shall have arisen] *either libellant or respondent resides.*

Where libels for divorce shall be presented.

Petitions or libels for the annulment of [bigamous] *void or voidable* marriages may be exhibited to the court of common pleas of the county where the marriage was contracted, or in the county where either the libellant or respondent resides, and, in such cases, residence of the libellant within the county or State, for any period shall not be required.

Where libels for annulments shall be presented.

AN ACT

Relating to judgments by agreement.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That whenever any parties to an action or proceeding at law shall have agreed to the entry of a particular judgment therein, any judge of the court, in which such action or proceeding is pending, may enter such judgment directly without the verdict of a jury, with the same force and effect as if such judgment were upon a verdict.

Judgments by agreement.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately upon its approval by the Governor.
