

in any criminal proceeding shall be payable by the county, with or without recourse, such costs shall include only one day's fees for each Commonwealth witness for each day he or she was in actual attendance in court under subpoena, regardless of the number of cases in which he or she may have been subpoenaed or appeared as a witness. In addition to the certification as to witnesses now required by the district attorney, each witness shall file a certificate before payment setting forth that he or she has not received pay or compensation for the same day or days in any other case.

AN ACT

Authorizing the State Historical Commission to investigate and to report to the next session of the Legislature upon the area, boundaries, and dimensions of the Brandywine Battlefield of the Revolutionary War and to accept gifts or deeds of historic objects or of land connected therewith.

Whereas, The site of the Brandywine Battlefield is the only unmarked battlefield of the Revolutionary War in any of the original thirteen colonies; and

Preamble.

Whereas, The Brandywine Battlefield is the only battlefield of any war within this Commonwealth that is still unmarked and not yet officially recognized as to its major historical importance; therefore

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the State Historical Commission be and is hereby authorized to investigate and to report to the next session of the Legislature as to the area, boundaries, and dimensions constituting the Brandywine Battlefield of the Revolutionary War.

State Historical Commission to report on Brandywine Battlefield.

Section 2. That the State Historical Commission be and is hereby authorized and empowered to accept gifts of historic objects connected with the said Battle of the Brandywine and, in particular, to accept gifts or deeds of land lying within the area of the said Brandywine Battlefield in conformity with the provisions of the act, approved the twenty-fifth day of July one thousand nine hundred and thirteen (Pamphlet Laws, one thousand two hundred and sixty-five), "An act providing for the establishment of the Pennsylvania Historical Commission," et cetera, and amendments and supplements thereto.

State Historical Commission empowered to accept gifts of historic objects and land.
