## AN ACT

To add clause (i) to section 1803 of the act, approved the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws 177), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," by authorizing the Department of Forests and Waters to grant certain privileges on land under its jurisdiction.

Section 1803, act of April 9, 1929, P. L. 177, further amended by adding, after clause (h), a new clause (i).

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1803 of the act, approved the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws 177), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," is hereby further amended by adding, after clause (h), a new clause to read as follows:

Section 1803. Forests; Powers.—The Department of Forests and Waters shall have the power:

• • • • •

(i) *To grant to individuals, groups of individuals, associations, firms, partnerships or corporations the privilege to erect, construct, maintain and operate, on and over State owned or leased lands under the jurisdiction of the Department of Forests and Waters, antennas, towers, stations, cables and other devices and apparatus, helpful, necessary or required for broadcasting, telecasting, transmission, relaying or reception of television. It may charge for such privilege such rental and damages as the department deems the conditions and circumstances warrant.*

Section 2. The provisions of this act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

AN ACT

To amend subsection (f) of section 906 of the act, approved the third day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 1225), entitled "An act concerning game and other wild birds and wild animals; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," by authorizing the Pennsylvania Game Commission to grant certain privileges on land under its jurisdiction.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (f) of section 906 of the act, approved the third day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 1225), entitled "An act concerning game and other wild birds and wild animals; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," as amended by the act, approved the ninth day of May, one thousand nine hundred forty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 183), is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 906. Use of Lands.—

• • • • •

(f) The commission may grant any or all of the following rights on lands acquired for its use, when such grants will not adversely affect game protection and propagation, and may charge for such licenses such rental and damages as the commission deems the conditions and circumstances warrant:

"The Game Law."
