The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Prisons.

Section 1. The act, approved the seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred twenty-five (Pamphlet Laws 188), entitled "An act authorizing and empowering the Department of Welfare to sell surplus products of prison industries to the Government of the United States, including all departments, bureaus, commissions, and other agencies thereof existing under acts of the Congress of the United States; and to the Government of any state or commonwealth of the United States; and to any county, city, borough, township, or other organized subdivision of any state or commonwealth of the United States; and to any institution maintained by, or receiving aid from, any state or commonwealth of the United States, or any organized sub-division thereof," is hereby repealed. Act of April 7, 1925, P. L. 188, repealed.

AN ACT

To repeal the act, approved the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred twenty-five (Pamphlet Laws 304), entitled "An act authorizing and directing the Department of Welfare to pay from the manufacturing fund wages to all inmates in penitentiaries, reformatories, and other correctional institutions of the Commonwealth who perform labor necessary to the proper maintenance of such institutions and the inmates thereof, independent of payments provided by law for inmates directly laboring on industries therein."

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Prisons.

Section 1. The act, approved the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred twenty-five (Pamphlet Laws 304), entitled "An act authorizing and directing the Department of Welfare to pay from the manufacturing fund wages to all inmates in penitentiaries, reformatories, and other correctional institutions of the Commonwealth who perform labor necessary to the proper maintenance of such institutions and the inmates thereof, independent of payments provided by law for inmates directly laboring on industries therein," is hereby repealed.
