

And being the same land conveyed to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania by deed of Lackawanna County Institution District et al., by deed dated and recorded December 14, 1948, in Lackawanna County Deed Book Volume 478, at page 577.

The conveyance shall be made under and subject, nevertheless, to all easements, servitudes and rights of others, including but not confined to streets, roadways and rights of any telephone, telegraph, water, electric, gas or pipe line companies, as well as under and subject, nevertheless, to any estate or tenancies vested in third persons, whether or not appearing of record, for any portion of the said land or improvements erected thereon.

Conditions.

Section 2. The deed of conveyance shall be approved by the Department of Justice and shall be executed by the Secretary of Property and Supplies in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Approval and execution.

Section 3. All moneys received from the sale of the land herein authorized to be conveyed shall be deposited in the General Fund.

Disposition of funds.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Amending the act of May 4, 1927 (P. L. 519), entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending, and consolidating the law relating to boroughs," authorizing appropriations for handling storage and distribution of surplus foods.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

The Borough Code.

Section 1. Section 1202, act of May 4, 1927 (P. L. 519), known as "The Borough Code," reenacted and amended July 10, 1947 (P. L. 1621), is amended by adding, after clause LXVI, a new clause to read:

Section 1202. Specific Powers.—The powers of the borough shall be vested in the corporate officers. They shall have power:

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LXVII. Appropriations for Handling, Storage and Distribution of Surplus Foods.—The corporate officers of any borough may appropriate from borough funds moneys for the handling, storage and distribution of

surplus foods obtained either through a local, State or Federal agency.

All appropriations of moneys heretofore made by the corporate officers of any borough for the handling, storage and distribution of surplus foods obtained either through a local, State or Federal agency are hereby validated.

AN ACT

Amending the act of May 4, 1927 (P. L. 519), entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending, and consolidating the law relating to boroughs," authorizing boroughs to acquire and maintain historical property, and permitting borough planning commissions to make recommendations in relation thereto.

The Borough Code.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1147, act of May 4, 1927, P. L. 519, reenacted and amended July 10, 1947, P. L. 1621, further amended.

Section 1. Section 1147, act of May 4, 1927 (P. L. 519), known as "The Borough Code," reenacted and amended July 10, 1947 (P. L. 1621), is amended to read:

Section 1147. Maps; Recommendations.—The Borough Planning Commission may make, or cause to be made, and lay before council, and, at its discretion cause to be published, maps of the borough or any portion thereof, including territory extending three miles beyond the borough limits, showing the streets and highways, and other natural and artificial features, and also locations proposed by it for any new public buildings, civic centre, street, parkway, park, playground, or any other public ground or public improvement, or any widening, extension, or relocation of the same, *or for the location or preservation of ancient landmarks and other property of historical or antiquarian interest*, or any change in the borough plan by it deemed advisable; and it may make recommendations to council, from time to time, concerning any such matters and things aforesaid, for action by council thereon, and, in so doing, have regard for the present conditions and future needs and growth of the borough, and the distribution and relative location of all the principal and other streets and railways, waterways and all other means of public travel and business communications, as well as the distribution and relative location of all public buildings, public grounds, and open spaces devoted to public use.
