

LAWS OF PENNSYLVANIA,
RESOLUTIONS
PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION
OF THE COMMONWEALTH

(These Joint Resolutions Nos. 1, 2 and 3 were passed for the first time at the
Legislative Session of 1957 and for the second time at the Legislative
Session of 1959.)

No. 1

A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to article two, section four of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by providing for annual sessions of the General Assembly.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby resolves as follows:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of the eighteenth article thereof:

That section four, article two of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania be amended to read:

Section 4. Upon adoption of this amendment the General Assembly shall meet at twelve o'clock noon on the first Tuesday of January of the year following such adoption, and shall meet at such time annually thereafter, and at other times when convened by the Governor. At regular sessions convening in even-numbered years the General Assembly shall not enact any laws, except laws raising revenue and laws making appropriations.

No. 2

A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to article nine, section eight of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, increasing the borrowing capacity of school districts.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby resolves as follows:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of the eighteenth article thereof:

That section eight, article nine of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania be amended to read:
