

or deliver to any stamp affixing agency any stamps of the face amount of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or more at any one time, such agent shall be entitled to receive, as compensation for his services and expenses as agent in affixing such stamps and to retain out of the moneys to be paid by him for such stamps, a commission of [one and one-half per centum (1½%) *three per centum (3%)*] on the par value thereof if and when such agent has purchased the stamps affixed by him directly from the department or other authorized person.

**Effective date.** Section 3. **Effective Date.**—This act shall take effect June 1, 1963.

### AN ACT

Amending the act of May 29, 1935 (P. L. 244), entitled "An act creating a Local Government Commission to study and report on functions of local government; their allocation and elimination; the cost of local government and means of reducing it; and the consolidation of local government; and making an appropriation," changing provisions relating to appointment, the terms of the members of the commission and the time of organization and terminating the terms of members presently serving.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1, act of

Section 1. Section 1, act of May 29, 1935 (P. L. 244), entitled "An act creating a Local Government Commission to study and report on functions of local government; their allocation and elimination; the cost of local government and means of reducing it; and the consolidation of local government; and making an appropriation," amended December 8, 1959 (P. L. 1742), is amended to read:

**Local  
Government  
Commission.**

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That a commission is hereby created which shall consist of ten members to serve without compensation, five of whom shall be appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate, *three from among the majority party and two from among the minority party*, and five shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House, *three from among the majority party and two from among the minority party*. The commission shall be known as the "Local Government Commission." The term of each member of the

commission shall run from the date of his respective appointment until [the end] *thirty days after the convening* of the next regular session of the General Assembly in odd numbered years and until his successor is appointed and qualified. [After the close of each regular session of the General Assembly in odd numbered years, the] *The President pro tempore and the Speaker shall make the appointments authorized by this section. Such appointments shall take effect thirty-one days after the convening of each regular session of the General Assembly in odd numbered years.* Any vacancy happening in the membership of the commission shall be filled by the appointing power making the original appointment for the unexpired term. The commission shall organize as soon as may be after the [close] *appointment of members thirty-one days after the convening* of each regular session of the General Assembly in odd numbered years, at the call of the President pro tempore of the Senate, by electing a chairman, vice-chairman, and a secretary. The secretary need not be a member of the commission.

Filling vacancies.

Organization of commission.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall apply to all members of the Local Government Commission hereafter appointed.

Effective immediately.

Section 3. The terms of all members of the local government commission who are serving on the effective date of this act shall terminate on the effective date of this act. Immediately upon the effective date of this act, the President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall appoint the full membership to the commission, and the term of each member so appointed shall run from the date of his appointment until thirty days after the convening of the 1965 regular session of the General Assembly and until his successor is appointed and qualified. The commission shall meet and organize at the call of the President pro tempore of the Senate.
