

ings and facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on workmen's compensation insurance, premiums on policies of liability insurance covering the operation of permanently assigned automobiles, premiums on surety bonds and medical payment insurance for volunteer workers in State institutions, the purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery other than passenger motor vehicles, and all other incidental costs and expenses including payment to the Department of Property and Supplies of mileage charges for the use of automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred through the Purchasing Fund.

Section 7. Purchase of supplies, materials and equipment shall not be deemed to be committed or encumbered until contracts covering said purchases have been entered into with the vendors.

Section 8. In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies furnished to employes and other persons, except inmates by an institution, shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the several respective institutions for the operation and maintenance of said institutions.

Further, in addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal government, or from any other source as contributions for the programs provided herein, shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective appropriations.

Section 9. That part of all appropriations in this act unexpended, uncommitted and unencumbered as of June 30, 1965, shall automatically lapse as of that date.

Section 10. The provisions of this act shall be severable. If any provision of this act is found by a court of record to be unconstitutional and void, the remaining provisions of the act shall, nevertheless, remain valid unless the court finds the valid provisions of the law are so essentially *and inseparably connected with and depend upon the void provision that it cannot be presumed the General Assembly would have enacted the remaining valid provisions without the void one, or unless the court finds the remaining valid provisions standing alone are incomplete and are incapable of being executed in accordance with the legislative intent.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P. L. 213), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making an appropriation for carrying the same into effect.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the sum of twenty-five million two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,225,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the trustees of the Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1964 to June 30, 1965, for the following purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For the general maintenance of instruction, research and extension in the College of Agriculture, the Mont Alto State Forest School, the College of Business Administration, the College of Engineering and Architecture, the College of Liberal Arts, the College of Home Economics, the College of Mineral Industries, the College of Chemistry and Physics, the College of Education, the Graduate School, the College of Physical Education and Athletics, the General Extension Services and for the general maintenance of other schools, departments, offices and services, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest, and for payment into the Social Security Contribution Fund such amounts as may be necessary in paying the university's share of Social Security taxes with respect to compensation of employes of the Pennsylvania State University, and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable, but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed twenty-four million one hundred ninety-seven thousand seven hundred dollars (\$24,197,700).

(2) For purchase of movable equipment for new buildings constructed by the General State Authority, five hundred eighty-four thousand dollars (\$584,000).

(3) For the purpose of carrying on research and investigation to discover by-products of anthracite and bituminous coal and uses therefor, of developing new scientific, chemical, industrial, domestic and other uses and new and extended markets for anthracite coal and its products, and for employing engineers, chemists, technical experts, assistants, clerks, stenographers and other employes and purchasing such machinery, supplies, equipment, apparatus and other things necessary in the furtherance of the aforesaid research and investigation to be used by the College of Mineral Industries under the supervision of the State Department of Mines and Mineral Industries. Moneys shall be expended for this purpose only to the extent that a sum equal to fifty per centum of thirty-seven thousand eight hundred dollars (\$37,800), the amount to be expended by the Commonwealth, is contributed to the Pennsylvania State University by the members of the anthracite and bituminous coal industry.

Affidavits evidencing such contributions shall be submitted by the University to the Auditor General.

(4) For the purpose of carrying on research and investigation of long range problems affecting the mineral industries. No more shall be expended for this purpose than may be required to match an equal sum contributed to the university by one or more industries for such research and investigation. The total contribution by the Commonwealth shall not exceed thirty-one thousand fifty dollars (\$31,050). Affidavits evidencing such contribution shall be submitted by the university to the Auditor General.

(5) The support of research and investigation of basic problems affecting the slate and other nonmetallic mineral industries, eighteen thousand nine hundred dollars (\$18,900).

(6) For the support of research and investigation of long range basic problems affecting the mineral industries, seventeen thousand five hundred fifty dollars (\$17,550).

(7) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agricultural Experiment Station for the support of research and investigation directed toward the development and production of superior strains of crops and livestock and to develop more efficient methods of producing and marketing such products, eighty-one thousand dollars (\$81,000).

(8) For the maintenance and the support of research and experimental investigation on problems relating to the petroleum industry of the State, seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000).

(9) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agricultural Experiment Station for the erection of experimental mushroom houses and research in the communicable diseases of mushrooms and other phases of the mushroom industry, fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000).

(10) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agricultural Experiment Station for research and investigation of mastitis in the dairy cattle, twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000).

(11) For research in the diseases of maple trees, ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

(12) For the general maintenance of instruction, research and extension in graduate centers, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000).

Section 2. The colleges carrying out the research projects hereby authorized shall submit a progress report on each project to each member of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania six months after the effective date of this act and a complete report by June 30, 1965.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1964.

AN ACT

Amending the act of December 19, 1963 (1963 Special Session No. 2, Appropriations Act No. 1A), entitled "An act making appropriations to the Department of Public Welfare for the maintenance of certain hospitals for payment of purchased hospital and post-hospital care," changing the purpose and conditions under which funds may be expended with respect to Magee Memorial Hospital for Convalescents and making changes to conform to the Governor's qualified approval of the act.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The first paragraph of section 1, act of December 19, 1963 (1963 Special Session No. 2, Appropriations Act No. 1A), entitled "An act making appropriations to the Department of Public Welfare for the maintenance of certain hospitals for payment of purchased hospital and post-hospital care," is amended to read and the section is amended by adding the following hospital:

Section 1. The sum of [nine million five hundred thirty-three thousand twenty dollars (\$9,533,020)] *nine million five hundred seventy-five thousand twenty dollars (\$9,575,020)*, or as much thereof as is necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the period July 1, 1963, to February 29, 1964, to be by it paid to the hospitals hereinafter designated in the amounts hereinafter specified for the purpose of the maintenance of such hospitals in accordance with the rules and regulations issued by the Department of Public Welfare and the Department of the Auditor General as prescribed by law at the rate of ten dollars (\$10) per diem, but not to exceed the regularly established ward rate, nursery rate, pediatric rate or any lesser rate contracted between the hospital and patient for the medical and surgical services rendered to, and maintenance of, persons treated in the hospital, who are entitled to free service. Such rates to include only room, board and general bed care but not to exceed rates charged other classes of patients or the actual cost to the hospital of such services and maintenance, whichever is the least. *All moneys received on account of the care of the patient, shall be reported as a credit against the gross earnings of free and part-pay service chargeable against this appropriation: Provided, That no payment shall be made from this appropriation for services rendered to persons aged sixty-five or over by any hospital hereinafter designated that is qualified to receive payments for medical assistance for the aged under the Public Assistance Law:

Section 2. Section 2 of the act is amended to read:

six hundred ten dollars (\$752,610), or as much thereof as is necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the period July 1, 1963, to June 30, 1964, to be by it paid to the hospitals hereinafter designated in the amounts hereinafter specified for the purpose of the maintenance of such hospitals in accordance with the rules and regulations issued by the Department of Public Welfare and the Department of the Auditor General as prescribed by law at the rate of ten dollars (\$10) per diem but not to exceed the regularly established ward rate, nursery rate, pediatric rate or any lesser rate contracted between the hospital and the patient for the medical and surgical services rendered to, and maintenance of, persons treated in the hospital, who are entitled to free service. Such rates to include only room, board and general bed care but not to exceed rates charged other classes of patients or the actual cost to the hospital of such services and maintenance, whichever is the least. *All moneys received on account of the care of the patient shall be reported as a credit against the gross earnings of free and part-pay service chargeable against this appropriation: Provided, That no payments shall be made from this appropriation for services rendered by any hospital hereinafter designated that is qualified to receive payments for medical assistance for the aged or purchased hospital care under the Public Assistance Law:

Section 1. The appropriation of one hundred dollars (\$100) to the Department of Property and Supplies from the General Fund

Making an appropriation for the maintenance, repair and improvement of the Port of Philadelphia.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Commerce, Bureau of Port Operations of the City of Philadelphia, for the maintenance, repair and improvement of the Port of Philadelphia for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965.

The moneys so appropriated shall only be expended as authorized and directed by the Council of the City of Philadelphia and shall be drawn from the State Treasury upon warrants drawn by the Auditor General upon requisition by the Chief of the Bureau of Port Operations of said city.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1964.

Making appropriations to the Trustees of Drexel Institute of Technology of the State of Pennsylvania at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Section 1. The sum of eight hundred sixty-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$862,500), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of Drexel Institute of Technology of the State of Pennsylvania, at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for the

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general maintenance of the institute and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interests of the institute.

Section 2. The sum of one hundred fifteen thousand dollars (\$115,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Drexel Institute of Technology of the State of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for the Library School.

Section 1. The sum of four million two hundred eleven thousand nine hundred fifty-one dollars (\$4,211,951), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for the general maintenance of the university and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interests of the university.

Section 2. The sum of one million five hundred ninety-three thousand dollars (\$1,593,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for the general maintenance of and for research in the School of Medicine of the University and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interests of the School of Medicine.

Section 3. The sum of eight hundred fifty-three thousand five hundred eighty-nine dollars (\$853,589), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for the general maintenance of and for research in the School of Veterinary Medicine of the University and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interests of the School of Veterinary Medicine.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1964.

Making appropriations to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the general maintenance and operation of the university, for the School of Medicine and the Library School.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of three million five hundred seventeen thousand eighty-five dollars (\$3,517,085), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for the general maintenance of the University of Pittsburgh and for the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the university.

Section 2. The sum of one million one hundred eighty-eight thousand one hundred eighty dollars (\$1,188,180), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for the general maintenance of the School of Medicine, including the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary and maintenance of teaching facilities in hospitals for students of the School of Medicine, including the Maternity Dispensary and other dispensaries.

Section 3. The sum of sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for the general maintenance of the Library School and for the purchase of such equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the university.

Section 4. The sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for a Professorship in Experimental Medi-

cine in the School of Medicine of the University to be known as the Commonwealth *Jonas E. Salk Professorship of Experimental Medicine, and to be filled by that member of the medical profession who, in the opinion of the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh, has made an outstanding contribution in the field of experimental medicine.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1964.

The sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for the conduct, operation or contracting for training courses to be given at John J. Kane Hospital and cooperating institutions for the personnel of county homes, nursing and convalescent homes and nonprofit homes for the aged.

Making an appropriation to the Dickinson School of Law, Carlisle, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Dickinson School of Law, Carlisle, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for the general maintenance of the school for current expenses, including but not limited to the purchase of equipment and supplies and the payment of salaries, for alterations and improvements to the grounds and buildings and their furnishings, for improvement of the law library, for research projects and for such other purposes as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the school.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1964.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Department of Health for research at the Lankenau Hospital, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on problems of aging.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000), is hereby appropriated to the Department of Health for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for research at the Lankenau Hospital, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on the problems of aging.

The sum appropriated by this act shall be used by the Lankenau Hospital to conduct research, both clinical and basic, in the field of aging. Such research shall include (1) an experimental community geriatric clinic for the multidisciplinary evaluation of the aging individual in health and disease with emphasis on preventive health maintenance, early diagnosis of disease, assessment of total performance, capacity fitness for work and retirement, which will be available for all patients who may benefit from the service within the capacity of this clinic, (2) a research ward with beds devoted to controlled nutritional balance studies for specific projects related to chronic diseases of the older individual, such as osteoporosis cardiovascular, aging, connective tissue disorders and disturbances in the skeletal-muscular system, (3) studies on the physiology of aging with particular reference to the development of criteria and practical tests for the assessment of functional capacity and biological aging, and (4) basic biological research with particular reference to such aspects as genetic factors in aging, the role of physical activity in age changes and longitudinal studies covering the entire life span and cellular changes accompanying the aging process.

To implement the provisions of this act the hospital may establish a center for aging research and may for that purpose use the moneys hereby appropriated.

Section 2. The Department of Health shall ascertain that the funds appropriated by this act are used by the Lankenau Hospital for the purposes set forth in the act.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1964.

The sum of one hundred seventy thousand nine hundred dollars (\$170,900), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Philadelphia Museum College of Art, Philadelphia, for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for maintenance and the purchase of apparatus, supplies and equipment.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1964.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Health for treatment, diagnostic and other special services for mentally retarded children and those afflicted with other cerebral dysfunctions at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh.

Section 1. The sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Military Affairs for the fiscal year July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1965, for payment of services in connection with the function of and by authority of the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission provided for under contract with the Pennsylvania Wing Civil Air Patrol.

Section 2. Vouchers covering all expenditures of such funds authorized and appropriated hereby, shall be issued by the commanding officer of the Pennsylvania Wing Civil Air Patrol and approved by the Department of Military Affairs.

The sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1965, to the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission to aid in the maintenance and operation of a shrine to house a replica of the Liberty Bell in the Zion's Reformed Church in Allentown, Lehigh County, where the original Liberty Bell was housed between September 1777 and August 1778.
