Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1225), entitled "An act concerning game and other wild birds and wild animals; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," reducing certain age requirements.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Clause (d) of section 316, act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1225), known as "The Game Law," amended June 24, 1939 (P.L.810), is amended to read:

Section 316. Certain Acts Declared Unlawful.—It is unlawful for any person:

* * *

(d) To use firearms of any kind, or a bow and arrow, for the purpose of hunting any wild birds or wild animals unless, if between the ages of twelve and fourteen, accompanied by a parent or guardian, or some other member of his family [twenty-one] eighteen years of age, or older, or if between the ages of fourteen and sixteen years, unless accompanied by an adult at least [twenty-one] eighteen years of age, unless such hunting is done on the premises 'whereon such person resides;
