SB 832

Amending the act of May 17, 1949 (P.L.1406, No.419), entitled "An act providing for the payment of salaries to the president and members of the town council of incorporated towns, at the discretion of the town council, and for the collection and docketing of costs and fees by the president of town council acting as justice of the peace," increasing the compensation of councilmen.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Sections 2 and 5, act of May 17, 1949 (P.L.1406, No.419), entitled "An act providing for the payment of salaries to the president and members of the town council of incorporated towns, at the discretion of the town council, and for the collection and docketing of costs and fees by the president of town council acting as justice of the peace," are amended to read:

Section 2. Salary of President of Town Council Limited.—The salary of a president of a town council shall not exceed per annum [**one hundred dollars (\$100)**] *two hundred dollars (\$200)* per thousand for the first ten thousand (10,000) population or fraction thereof, the population to be determined by the last United States decennial census or by two and one-half (2 1/2) times the number of registered voters in the town, as shown by the last registration thereof, whichever may be the greater: Provided, That in any town whose population shall exceed ten thousand (10,000), the town council may by ordinance fix the salary of the president of the town council at any sum not exceeding [**two thousand dollars (\$2000)**] *three thousand dollars (\$3000)*, and in towns whose population shall exceed twenty thousand (20,000), the town council may by ordinance fix the salary of the president of the town council at any sum not exceeding [**three thousand dollars (\$3000)**] *four thousand dollars (\$4000)*.

Section 5. Salary of Members of Town Council.—(a) the councilmen of any incorporated town may receive compensation to be fixed by ordinance at any time and from time to time as follows: (1) in towns whose population is seven hundred fifty (750) or less, a maximum of [**five dollars (\$5)**] *ten dollars (\$10)* a month; (2) in towns whose population is more than seven hundred fifty (750) and not more than fifteen hundred (1500), a maximum of [**ten dollars (\$10)**] *twenty dollars (\$20)* a month; (3) in towns whose population is more than fifteen hundred (1500) and not more than twenty-five hundred (2500), a maximum of [**fifteen dollars (\$15)**] *thirty dollars (\$30)* a month; (4) in towns whose population is more than twenty-five hundred (2500) and not more than five thousand (5000), a maximum of [**twenty dollars (\$20)**] *forty dollars (\$40)* a month; (5) in towns whose population is more than five thousand (5000), a maximum of [**twenty-five dollars (\$25)**] *fifty dollars (\$50)* a month.

(b) The population shall be determined by the last United States decennial census or by two and one-half (2 1/2) times the number of registered voters in the town as shown by the last registration thereof, whichever may be the greater.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
