## AN ACT

HB 1335

Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled "An act concerning townships of the second class; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," providing for payment by the townships of costs of meetings of county associations of township officers.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 604, act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), known as "The Second Class Township Code," reenacted and amended July 10, 1947 (P.L.1481, No.567), and amended June 1, 1956 (P.L.2021, No.677), is amended to read:

Section 604. [County to Pay Expenses.—The county treasurer shall, on warrants of the county commissioners, pay to the treasurer of such association, from the county funds, the necessary expenses incurred for the holding of such annual or semi-annual convention, including the necessary expenses of the secretary. The total sum thus paid by any county shall not exceed one hundred and twenty-five dollars a year.

Within thirty days after each such convention, the treasurer of such association shall file with the county commissioners an itemized statement, under oath, showing when and where such convention was held, the number of township supervisors, auditors, assessors, tax collectors, solicitors, engineers, and township secretaries present, and all the expenses connected with such convention, together with proper voucher for all such expenses, and no payment shall be made to the treasurer of such association until he has presented to the county commissioners an itemized and verified statement of expenses. County Association Convention Expenses.—Expenses of the county association convention shall be paid from dues assessed by the association on each member township.

Section 2. Section 614 of the act is repealed.
