A SUPPLEMENT

SB 823

To the act of June 30, 1975 (No. 8-A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1975," itemizing appropriations required from the Motor License Fund for the proper operation of the several departments of the Commonwealth authorized to spend Motor License Fund moneys.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. This supplement shall be known and may be cited as the "Motor License Fund Supplement to the General Appropriation Act of 1975."

Section 2. The following sums or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1975 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1975.

To the Department of Transportation

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper administration of the Department of Transportation, including planning and research, engineering, right-of-way, highway construction, special projects and services, highway maintenance, service functions and transportation safety ..... \$330,781,000

For payment from the restricted revenue accounts for aviation fuel taxes and airport operations revenue, for aviation operations including the operation and maintenance of State-owned aircraft, payment of general expenses, supplies, printing and equipment; for the development and maintenance of State airports and the maintenance and repair of landing fields, intermediate landing fields, landing field equipment, beacon sites, other navigation facilities, and the encouragement and development of civil aeronautics ..... 3,852,000

For rental payments to the State Highway and Bridge Authority for projects constructed with funds borrowed by the Authority ..... 35,000,000

For payments to municipalities to assist in maintenance and construction costs of roads in accordance with the act of June 1, 1956 (P.L. 1944, No.655), relative to the allocation of highway funds .... 94,400,000

For payment from the restricted revenue account for aviation fuel taxes for airport construction and development including encouragement and development of aeronautics, development of State airports, assistance to political subdivisions and municipal authorities in the construction and improvement of airports and other aeronautical facilities ..... 1,550,000

No more shall be expended from this item for such purpose or any of them than may be required to match an equal sum contributed by any political subdivision, or municipality authority of the Commonwealth or by the Federal Government, or by a political subdivision or municipality authority and the Federal Government as provided in the act of May 2, 1947 (P.L.136, No.56), relating to Federal aid for airports.

To the Treasury Department

Section 3. In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal Government or from any other source as contributions to or payments for the programs provided herein shall be paid into the Motor License Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the Motor License Fund for the purposes and programs intended.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

To the Department of Transportation

The item in section 2 which provides as follows:

“For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper administration of the Department of Transportation, including planning and research, engineering, right-of-way, highway construction, special projects and services, highway maintenance, service functions and transportation safety .....\$330,781,000”

This item is approved in the sum of \$284,675,000. This reduction and those which follow, are necessary because of insufficient revenues.

The item in section 2 which provides as follows:

“For payments to municipalities to assist in maintenance and construction costs of roads in accordance with the act of June 1, 1956 (P.L.1944, No.655), relative to the allocation of highway funds .... 94,400,000”

This item is approved in the sum of \$89,600,000.

To the Pennsylvania State Police

## AN ACT

HB 693

Amending the act of July 5, 1973 (P.L.487, No.10-A), entitled "An act appropriating moneys in the Land and Water Development Fund derived from the issuance and sale of bonds and notes pursuant to the act of January 19, 1968 (P.L.996, No.443), known as 'The Land and Water Conservation and Reclamation Act,' " extending the time period and making additional appropriations to the Department of Environmental Resources, the Fish and Game Commissions and the Historical and Museum Commission.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Clauses (1) and (2) of section 1, act of July 5, 1973 (P.L.487, No.10-A), entitled "An act appropriating moneys in the Land and Water Development Fund derived from the issuance and sale of bonds and notes pursuant to the act of January 19, 1968 (P.L.996, No.443), known as 'The Land and Water Conservation and Reclamation Act,' " are amended to read:

Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated for the periods and purposes specified from moneys in the Land and Water Development Fund derived from the issuance and sale of bonds and notes pursuant to the act of January 19, 1968 (P.L.996, No.443), known as "The Land and Water Conservation and Reclamation Act":

(1) The sum of forty million dollars (\$40,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for **[two] the** fiscal years beginning July 1, 1973 *and ending June 30, 1981 and the additional sum of forty million dollars (\$40,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal years beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1981*, to the Department of Environmental Resources for the purposes specified in clause (1) of subsection (a) of section 16 of the act.

(2) The sum of twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for **[two] the** fiscal years beginning July 1, 1973 *and ending June 30, 1981 and the additional sum of twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal years beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1981*, to the Department of Environmental Resources, Fish and Game Commission and Historical and Museum Commission for the purposes specified in clause (3) of subsection (a) of section 16 of the act.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

SB 774

AN ACT

Making an appropriation from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the State Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1975.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$1,386,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to the State Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the State Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1975 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1975.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

AN ACT

SB 27

Making an appropriation to the Department of Transportation for promotion and improvement of transportation facilities and service for tourists visiting American Bicentennial Historical Sites.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$4,500,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Transportation for promotion and improvement of transportation facilities and service in order to restrain congestion and enhance mobility for tourists visiting historical sites associated with the American Bicentennial.

Section 2. The funds herein appropriated may be utilized for, but not limited to, preparation, promotion and distribution of transportation brochures, family pass subsidies, increasing passenger train, trolley and bus service, construction of parking areas, acquisition and erection of an aerial cable car or other device to bridge the Schuylkill River at Valley Forge, acquisition and/or rehabilitation of rolling stock and buses, and renovation of the train station at Valley Forge State Park.

Section 3. Whatsoever of the amount herein appropriated is unexpended or unencumbered as of July 1, 1976, shall lapse.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

A SUPPLEMENT

SB 770

To the act of November 30, 1965 (P.L.843, No.355), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of Temple University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in tuition; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the President to make an annual report of the operations of Temple University," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriation and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of Temple University at Philadelphia for the fiscal year July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

- (1) For educational and general expenditures ..... \$54,795,000
- (2) For cost of student aid ..... 3,018,000
- (3) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only ..... 5,375,000
- (4) For operation of dental clinics in the School of Dentistry ..... 500,000

Section 2. Payments to Temple University on account of the appropriations for all items, as provided in section 1, except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine, shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine only shall be made on the basis of full-time equivalent students enrolled at the rate of \$7,465 per student.

Section 3. If necessary, Temple University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. Payment to Temple University of the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of sections 2 and 3, on the basis of estimated costs and full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by Temple University to the

Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. Temple University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, Temple University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year the number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year. Such statement of expenditures, and number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Temple University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs and make certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs of the university except the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to November 1, 1976, shall cover the twelve-month period beginning September 1, 1975. The report shall include for each term during the period:

(1) The following counts and distributions:

(i) The definitions and numbers of full-time faculty members, of part-time faculty members, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) A distribution of part-time faculty members by the percentage of full-time employment.

(iii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division levels, and of graduate student credit hours divided into three levels — master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iv) Number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction, distributed by the number of sections scheduled in each course and the sections distributed by the number of students enrolled in each section.

(v) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) A classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian, and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: undergraduate courses only, graduate courses only, or both graduate and undergraduate courses; and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates for each such subdivided classification:

(i) The number.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral levels.

(iii) The sum of undergraduate student credit hours and the sum of graduate student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral levels.

(iv) Total salary paid.

(v) Total salary paid from university funds.

(vi) Total salary paid from Federal funds.

(vii) Total salary paid from other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each full-time faculty member identified by school, department and title:

(i) An analysis of the average hours per week spent in university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

(ii) The total salary paid and the salary paid from university funds.

Section 7. In addition to the requirements of section 6, the report covering the twelve-month period beginning September 1, 1975, shall include for all programs of the university except the Doctor of Medicine program:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree, and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1973, 1974 and 1975 and estimated 1976.

Section 8. The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "The Industry Audit Guide for Colleges and Universities" of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants of 1973, without exception.

Section 9. This act shall take effect immediately.

## AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Dickinson School of Law, Carlisle, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$99,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Dickinson School of Law, Carlisle, Pennsylvania, for its fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, for instruction in the School of Law only.

Section 2. Payments to the Dickinson School of Law, Carlisle, Pennsylvania on account of the appropriation provided in section 1 shall be on the basis of costs during the fiscal period.

Section 3. The Dickinson School of Law shall provide such information and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 4. The Dickinson School of Law, Carlisle, Pennsylvania shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Industry Audit Guide for Colleges and Universities" of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants of 1973, without exception.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Delaware Valley College of Science and Agriculture at Doylestown, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$185,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Delaware Valley College of Science and Agriculture at Doylestown, Pennsylvania, for its fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976 for instruction.

Section 2. Payments to the Delaware Valley College of Science and Agriculture at Doylestown, Pennsylvania, on account of the appropriation provided in section 1 shall be on the basis of costs during the fiscal period.

Section 3. The college shall provide such information and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 4. The Delaware Valley College of Science and Agriculture at Doylestown, Pennsylvania shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Industry Audit Guide for Colleges and Universities" of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants of 1973, without exception.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Philadelphia College of Textiles and Science.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$250,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Philadelphia College of Textiles and Science for its fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, for instruction.

Section 2. Payments to the Philadelphia College of Textiles and Science on account of the appropriation provided in section 1 of this act shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal period.

Section 3. The Philadelphia College of Textiles and Science shall provide such information and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 4. The Philadelphia College of Textiles and Science shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Industry Audit Guide for Colleges and Universities" of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants of 1973, without exception.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Trustees of Drexel University of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$3,018,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of Drexel University of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for its fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, for general institutional expenses.

Section 2. Payments to Drexel University, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on account of the appropriation provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal period.

Section 3. The university shall provide such information and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may provide.

Section 4. Drexel University, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Industry Audit Guide for Colleges and Universities" of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants of 1973, without exception.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

SB 734

Making an appropriation to the Trustees of the Berean Training and Industrial School at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. A SUPPLEMENT

SB 769

To the act of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.87, No.3), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of the University of Pittsburgh," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations, and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, for the purpose and in the amounts as shown:

- (1) For educational and general expenditures . . . \$50,825,000
- (2) For cost of student aid . . . . . 2,960,000
- (3) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only . . 3,986,000
- (4) For operation of dental clinics in the School of  
Dental Medicine . . . . . 500,000

Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for all items, as provided in section 1 except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of full-time equivalent student enrollment at the rate of \$7,465 per student.

Section 3. If necessary the University of Pittsburgh may transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs and full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program. The

estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, the number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

Such statement of expenditures, and number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs and make a certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs of the university except the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to November 1, 1976, shall cover the twelve-month period beginning September 1, 1975. The report shall include for each term during the period:

(1) The following counts and distributions:

(i) The definitions and numbers of full-time faculty members, of part-time faculty members, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) A distribution of part-time faculty members by the percentage of full-time employment.

(iii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division levels, and of graduate student credit hours divided into three levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iv) Number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction, distributed by the number of sections scheduled in each course and the sections distributed by the number of students enrolled in each section.

(v) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) A classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian, and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: undergraduate courses only, graduate courses only, or both graduate and undergraduate courses; and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates for each such subdivided classification:

(i) The number.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral levels.

(iii) The sum of undergraduate student credit hours and the sum of graduate student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral levels.

(iv) Total salary paid.

(v) Total salary paid from university funds.

(vi) Total salary paid from Federal funds.

(vii) Total salary paid from other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each full-time faculty member identified by school, department and title:

(i) An analysis of the average hours per week spent in university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

(ii) The total salary paid and the salary paid from university funds.

Section 7. In addition to the requirements of section 6, the report covering the twelve-month period beginning September 1, 1975, shall include for all programs of the university except the Doctor of Medicine program:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree, and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1973, 1974 and 1975 and estimated 1976.

Section 8. The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "Industry Audit Guide for Colleges and Universities" of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants of 1973, without exception.

Section 9. This act shall take effect immediately.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the following sums or as much thereof as may be necessary are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

- (1) For educational and general expenditures . . . \$71,593,000
- (2) For cost of student aid . . . . . 1,760,000
- (3) For cost of extension and public services . . . 9,626,000
- (4) For cost of research . . . . . 17,064,000
- (5) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only . . . 2,665,000

Section 2. Payments to Pennsylvania State University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of full-time equivalent students enrollment at the rate of \$7,465 per student.

Section 3. If necessary, the Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1), (2), (3) and (4): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. Payments to the Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of sections 2 and 3, on the basis of estimated costs and full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to

the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the Pennsylvania State University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, the number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in sections 2 and 3, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

Such statement of expenditures and number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the Pennsylvania State University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs and make a certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs of the university except the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to November 1, 1976, shall cover the twelve-month period beginning September 1, 1975. The report shall include for each term during the period:

(1) The following counts and distributions:

(i) The definitions and numbers of full-time faculty members, of part-time faculty members, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) A distribution of part-time faculty members by the percentage of full-time employment.

(iii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division levels, and of graduate student

credit hours divided into three levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iv) Number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction, distributed by the number of sections scheduled in each course and the sections distributed by the number of students enrolled in each section.

(v) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) A classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian, and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: undergraduate courses only, graduate courses only, or both graduate and undergraduate courses; and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates for each such subdivided classification:

(i) The number.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral levels.

(iii) The sum of undergraduate student credit hours and the sum of graduate student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral levels.

(iv) Total salary paid.

(v) Total salary paid from university funds.

(vi) Total salary paid from Federal funds.

(vii) Total salary paid from other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each full-time faculty member identified by school, department and title:

(i) An analysis of the average hours per week spent in university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

(ii) The total salary paid and the salary paid from university funds.

Section 7. In addition to the requirements of section 6, the report covering the twelve-month period beginning September 1, 1975, shall include for all programs of the university except the Doctor of Medicine program:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree, and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1973, 1974 and 1975 and estimated 1976.

Section 8. The Pennsylvania State University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required

under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "Industry Audit Guide for Colleges and Universities" of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants of 1973, without exception.

Section 9. This act shall take effect immediately.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act of July 7, 1972 (P.L.743, No.176), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of Lincoln University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related institution in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in tuition; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the President to make an annual report of the operations of Lincoln University," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriation, and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the College of Lincoln University, Chester County, for the fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

- (1) For educational and general expenditures . . . . \$2,428,000
- (2) For advanced institution development . . . . . 250,000
- (3) For accreditation improvement . . . . . 100,000

Section 2. Payments to Lincoln University on account of the appropriations for the items provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal period.

Section 3. Payments to Lincoln University of the appropriation herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal period.

Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2, on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by Lincoln University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 4. Lincoln University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal period to which this act relates, Lincoln University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal period. Such statement of expenditures and costs shall

be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of costs and make certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 5. The university shall provide such information and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 6. The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Industry Audit Guide for Colleges and Universities" of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants of 1973, without exception.

Section 7. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs of the university except the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to November 1, 1976, shall cover the twelve-month period beginning September 1, 1975. The report shall include for each term during the period:

(1) The following counts and distributions:

(i) The definitions and numbers of full-time faculty members, of part-time faculty members, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) A distribution of part-time faculty members by the percentage of full-time employment.

(iii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division levels, and of graduate student credit hours divided into three levels — master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iv) Number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction, distributed by the number of sections scheduled in each course and the sections distributed by the number of students enrolled in each section.

(v) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) A classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian, and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment -

undergraduate courses only, graduate courses only, or both graduate and undergraduate courses; and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment, full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates for each such subdivided classification:

(i) The number.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral levels.

(iii) The sum of undergraduate student credit hours and the sum of graduate student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral levels.

(iv) Total salary paid.

(v) Total salary paid from university funds.

(vi) Total salary paid from Federal funds.

(vii) Total salary paid from other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each full-time faculty member identified by school, department and title:

(i) An analysis of the average hours per week spent in university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

(ii) The total salary paid and the salary paid from university funds.

Section 8. In addition to the requirements of section 7, the report covering the twelve-month period beginning September 1, 1975, shall include for all programs of the university except the Doctor of Medicine program:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree, and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1973, 1974 and 1975 and estimated 1976.

Section 9. This act shall take effect immediately.

Section 2. Payments to the Pennsylvania College of Podiatric Medicine, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on account of the appropriation for the items provided in section 1 shall be on the basis of costs during the fiscal period.

Section 3. The university shall provide such information and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 4. The Pennsylvania College of Podiatric Medicine, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Industry Audit Guide for Colleges and Universities" of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants of 1973, without exception.

Section 1. (a) The sum of \$3,938,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, for instruction in the Doctor of Medicine program.

(b) The sum of \$750,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, for the general maintenance of the Thomas Jefferson University including the College of Allied Health Sciences.

Section 2. Payments to the Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on account of the appropriation for instructions in the Doctor of Medicine program as provided in subsection (a) of section 1 of this act shall be made on the basis of full-time student enrollment at the rate of \$4,400 per student.

Section 3. Payments to the Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on account of the appropriation provided in subsection (b) of section 1 of this act shall be made on the basis of cost during the fiscal period.

Section 4. The university shall provide such information and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 5. The Thomas Jefferson University of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Industry Audit Guide for Colleges and Universities" of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants of 1973, without exception.

Section 6. This act shall take effect July 1, 1975.

Amending the act of June 30, 1975 (No.8-A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1975," providing that the appropriation to the Department of Commerce for Bicentennial overburden, the appropriation to the Department of Community Affairs for housing and redevelopment assistance and the appropriation to the Legislative Department shall be continuing appropriations; changing or amending certain appropriations to the Governor, the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, the Auditor General, the Treasury Department, the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Banking, the Department of Commerce, the Department of Education, the Department of Environmental Resources, the Department of Health, the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, the Department of Insurance, the Department of Justice, the Department of Labor and Industry, the Department of Military Affairs, the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, the Department of Property and Supplies, the Department of Public Welfare, the Department of Revenue, the Department of State, the Pennsylvania State Police, the State Tax Equalization Board, the Department of Transportation, the Pennsylvania Public Television Network Commission, to the Senate and the House of Representatives for expenses of the Members, for the Appropriation Committees, for the Majority and Minority Leadership Accounts, and for the Majority and Minority Legislative Management Accounts, to the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate jointly for flags, and to the Judicial Department, clarifying appropriations to the General Assembly and to the Department of Public Welfare as to contracts for services for the aging; adding appropriations to the Governor for the National Governor's Conference, to the Department of Commerce for the community facilities program and for grants to municipalities for Bicentennial costs, to the Department of Community Affairs for housing and redevelopment assistance, to the Department of Education for replacement of a school building destroyed by mine subsidence, to the Department of Environmental Resources for deep mine safety inspections, for payment to the Solid Waste Demonstration Grants-in-Aid Fund, and for Presque Isle State Park, to the Department of Health for Cooley's Anemia, to the Department of Public Welfare for the Delaware County Center for the blind and for payments to second class counties for county homes, to the Senate and the House of Representatives for a Bicentennial Legislative Session and a Commonwealth Emergency Medical System; reinstating and reenacting appropriations to the Department of Public Welfare for child welfare programs and the food stamp program, and to the Judicial Department for county reimbursement for court costs; and transferring, reinstating and reenacting an appropriation to the Department of Health from the Department of Public Welfare for grants to county departments of health.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 2, act of June 30, 1975 (No.8-A), known as the "General Appropriation Act of 1975," is amended by changing or

amending certain appropriations to the Governor, the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, the Auditor General, the Treasury Department, the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Banking, the Department of Commerce, the Department of Education, the Department of Environmental Resources, the Department of Health, the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, the Department of Insurance, the Department of Justice, the Department of Labor and Industry, the Department of Military Affairs, the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, the Department of Property and Supplies, the Department of Public Welfare, the Department of Revenue, the Department of State, the Pennsylvania State Police, the State Tax Equalization Board, the Department of Transportation, the Pennsylvania Public Television Network Commission, the Senate and the House of Representatives for the expenses of the members, the Appropriations Committees, the Majority and Minority Leadership Accounts, and the Majority and Minority Legislative Management Accounts, to the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate jointly for flags, and to the Judicial Department; and by adding appropriations to the Governor for the National Governor's Conference, to the Department of Commerce for the community facilities program and for grants to municipalities for Bicentennial costs, to the Department of Community Affairs for housing and redevelopment assistance, to the Department of Education for a school building destroyed by mine subsidence, to the Department of Environmental Resources for deep mine safety inspections, for the Solid Waste Demonstration Grants-in-Aid Fund and for repairs at Presque Isle State Park, to the Department of Health for Cooley's Anemia, to the Department of Public Welfare for Delaware County Center for the Blind, and for payments to second class counties for county homes, to the Senate and to the House of Representatives for a Bicentennial Legislative Session and a Commonwealth Emergency Medical system; by reinstating and reenacting appropriations to the Department of Public Welfare for child welfare programs and the food stamp program, and to the Judicial Department for county reimbursement for court costs; and by transferring, reinstating and reenacting an appropriation to the Department of Health from the Department of Public Welfare for grants to county departments of health to read:

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expense of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, equipment, land and buildings and

for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1975 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1975.

Making an appropriation to the Pennsylvania College of Optometry, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Making an appropriation to The Medical College of Pennsylvania, East Falls, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$1,658,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to The Medical College of Pennsylvania located in East Falls, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for its fiscal period July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, for instruction in the Doctor of Medicine program.

Section 2. Payments to The Medical College of Pennsylvania, located at East Falls, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on account of the appropriation for instruction in the Doctor of Medicine program as provided in section 1 of this act shall be made on the basis of full-time student enrollment at the rate of \$4,400 per student.

Section 3. The college shall provide such information and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 4. The Medical College of Pennsylvania shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Industry Audit Guide for Colleges and Universities" of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants of 1973, without exception.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1975.
