## AN ACT

## HB 534

Authorizing the Department of General Services, on behalf of the Commonwealth, to acquire by gift certain land in Fulton Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of General Services, on behalf of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, is authorized and empowered to acquire from Donald Miller Goss, on behalf of the Commonwealth, certain land adjacent to the property known as the Robert Fulton Birthplace in Fulton Township, Lancaster County, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the middle of U.S. Highway 222 where its centerline intersects that of Legislative Route 36092 and T-339; thence along the middle of U.S. 222 on an arc of a 370 foot radius curve to the left 178.01 feet to a railroad spike the chord being 176.30 feet and bearing north 10 degrees 42 minutes 30 seconds east; thence along land of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Forests and Waters, passing over an iron pipe on sideline of road at 38.98 feet, south 51 degrees 30 minutes east 203.57 feet to an iron pipe; thence by same land south 52 degrees 59 minutes 30 seconds west 66.07 feet to a pk spike in the middle of Township Road T-339 after passing over an iron pipe on sideline of road at 29.32 feet; thence along the middle of road south 87 degrees 14 minutes 05 seconds west 139.48 feet to the place of beginning, Containing .39 acre more or less.

Section 2. Title to the property shall be taken subject to the easements presently on record and in existence.

Section 3. The property shall be under the jurisdiction and control of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission for preservation, care and maintenance as a part of the historical site known as the Robert Fulton Birthplace.

Section 4. The title to the property shall be taken in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in fee simple and before its acceptance shall be approved as provided by law.

Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
