SB 1409

Itemizing appropriations required from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985 for the proper operation of the several departments of the Commonwealth authorized to spend Motor License Fund moneys.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the Motor License Fund Appropriation Act of 1984.

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984:

To the Department of Transportation

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper administration of the Department of Transportation, including the Transportation Commission and Advisory Committee and the Statewide coordination of municipal services.....	\$20,353,000

To the Department of Transportation

For payment for aviation operations, including the operation and maintenance of State-owned aircraft, payment of general expenses, supplies, printing and equipment; for the development and maintenance of State airports and the maintenance and repair of landing fields, intermediate landing fields, landing field equipment, beacon sites and other navigation facilities; and for the encouragement and development of civil aeronautics.....	\$5,473,000
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For payment for airport construction and development, including encouragement and development of aeronautics, development of State airports and assistance to political subdivisions and municipal authorities in the construction and improvement of airports and other aeronautical facilities.....	2,200,000

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1984 or, if enacted subsequent to that date, then immediately.

HB 2115

Making an appropriation from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal year July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$8,524,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984.

Section 2. (a) No moneys shall be used for payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984 involving the internal control and investment performance audit of the Public School Employees' Retirement System as required by the Auditor General.

(b) When an internal control and investment performance audit of the Public School Employees' Retirement System is required by the Auditor General in a fiscal year in which the expense of such an audit has not been budgeted for by the Public School Employees' Retirement Board, the expense of the audit shall be borne by the Department of the Auditor General, and the Auditor General shall be required to request from and justify to the General Assembly a special appropriation to the Department of the Auditor General out of the General Fund for that purpose.

Section 3. Section 2 of this act shall be retroactive to July 1, 1983.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1984 or, if enacted subsequent to that date, then immediately.

SB 1340

Making appropriations from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the State Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal year July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$5,630,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to the State Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the State Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984.

Section 2. The sum of \$317,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the State Employees Retirement Fund to the State Employees Retirement Board for the fiscal period July 1, 1983 to June 30, 1984 for the payment of expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board and for the discharge of its obligations.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1984 or, if enacted subsequent to that date, then immediately.

HB 2110

Making appropriations from a restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Department of State for use by the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. (a) The sum of \$7,970,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Restricted Revenue Account within the General Fund to the Department of State to augment the general government appropriation for the operation of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs for the fiscal year July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985. No funds from this appropriation shall be used to fund the operation of the State Registration Board for Professional Engineers.

(b) The sum of \$525,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Restricted Revenue Account within the General Fund to the Department of State to augment the general government appropriation for the operation of the State Registration Board for Professional Engineers for the fiscal year July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985. Funds from this appropriation may be used to fund test sites, travel expenses and consultant fees at the discretion of the State Registration Board for Professional Engineers.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1984 or, if enacted subsequent to that date, then immediately.

APPROVED—The 30th day of June, A. D. 1984, except as to the following:

Section 1. * * *

(b) The sum of \$525,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Restricted Revenue Account within the General Fund to the Department of State to augment the general government appropriation for the operation of the State Registration Board for Professional Engineers for the fiscal year July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985. Funds from this appropriation may be used to fund test sites, travel expenses and consultant fees at the discretion of the State Registration Board for Professional Engineers.

* * *

I withhold my approval from this entire item. The Professional Licensure Augmentation Restricted Revenue Account was established as an integrated funding system to aid all professional licensing boards in meeting operating costs without placing an unduly heavy licensing burden on members of the various professions. Further, it serves to reduce operating costs through

allowing for multi-year licensing. This practice, for any single board, would result in wide swings in revenues annually, but the integrated restricted account device allows the scheduling of licensing by the various boards such that overall annual revenues are adequate for all boards' operations.

This act, by providing the State Registration Board for Professional Engineers with a line item appropriation, would set an undesirable precedent which could seriously weaken the system. If several other boards were to obtain the same preferential treatment, the integrated funding system would fail. With that failure the advantages to all would disappear, and certain of the boards would find it necessary to substantially increase their license fees.

For this reason I have withheld my approval. If the General Assembly acts to provide a supplemental appropriation to section 1 of this bill I will approve such a measure.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated out of the funds indicated to the Department of General Services for the fiscal year July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985 for payment of rental charges to The General State Authority:

Out of the Fish Fund.....	\$63,000

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1984 or, if enacted subsequent to that date, then immediately.

A SUPPLEMENT

HB 2052

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985 for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

- (1) For educational and general expenses and for participation by a representative of the institution, appointed by the chief executive officer thereof, as a member of the Pennsylvania Academic Commission on Technological Development, a commission for interinstitutional communication regarding technological innovation and development and for dissemination of information on such matters to the Pennsylvania business community and others who may use such information for new business and job development in Pennsylvania, such commission to be composed of representatives every State-owned or State-related educational or scientific institution receiving General Fund assistance from the Commonwealth..... \$118,557,000
- (2) For cost of research..... 10,627,000
- (3) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only..... 3,381,000
- (4) For cost of agricultural research..... 12,647,000
- (5) For cost of agricultural extension services..... 10,702,000
- (6) For the cost of operating Elizabethtown Hospital... 3,561,000
- (7) For cost of soil survey..... 100,000
- (8) To enhance recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students..... 200,000
- (9) For research into and operation of an oilfired boiler converted to coal-slurry..... 500,000
- (10) For Agricultural Extension Statewide Computer System Network..... 1,900,000

(11) For a small farm project.....	75,000
(12) For an attendant care study.....	50,000
(13) For the Buhl Henderson Library.....	25,000
(14) For Avian Flu research.....	375,000

Section 2. Payments to Pennsylvania State University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. If necessary, Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1(1), (2), (4), (5) and (6): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. (a) Payments to Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. Notwithstanding any provision of the General Appropriation Act of 1984 relating to the payment of retirement expenses, the Trustees of Pennsylvania State University shall make all required payments to the State Employees' Retirement Fund from the funds appropriated pursuant to this act.

Section 6. (a) Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, Pennsylvania State University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the Auditor General of the Commonwealth a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Pennsylvania State University to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 7. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs except the Doctor of Medicine

program. The report, to be submitted prior to September 1, 1985, shall cover the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1984 and shall include:

(1) The following counts and distributions for each term during the period:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full time, of faculty members employed part time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) The total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iii) The number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction scheduled by level of instruction, each further subdivided by two-digit Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) categories of instructional programs of higher education as defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, United States Department of Education.

(iv) The number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) For the summer term and the following academic year in total and for each two-digit CIP program category, a classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title, including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: teaching and non-teaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time and the following aggregates for each such subdivided classification:

(i) The number of faculty and other professional employees and their full-time equivalence in instructional and noninstructional functions.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate individual instruction courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate individual instruction courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iv) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(v) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(vi) The total salary paid for instructional functions and for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary paid for each of these functions from university funds, Federal funds and other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty member employed full time identified by two-digit CIP program category and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the average hours per week spent in university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

Section 8. In addition to the requirements in section 7 relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1984 shall include for all programs of the university:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 1982, 1983, 1984 and estimated 1985.

Section 9. Pennsylvania State University shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 10. Pennsylvania State University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance Manual," United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975), with the exceptions set forth in the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State-Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1982-1983." Credits granted for nontraditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong learning, etc., including all related costs and revenues thereof, shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and included under "Public Service."

Section 11. This act shall take effect July 1, 1984 or, if enacted subsequent to that date, then immediately.

HB 2053

To the act of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.87, No.3), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of the University of Pittsburgh," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985 for the purpose and in the amounts as shown:

- (1) For educational and general expenses and for participation by a representative of the institution, appointed by the chief executive officer thereof, as a member of the Pennsylvania Academic Commission on Technological Development, a commission for interinstitutional communication regarding technological innovation and development and for dissemination of information on such matters to the Pennsylvania business community and others who may use such information for new business and job development in Pennsylvania, such commission to be composed of representatives of every State-owned or State-related educational or scientific institution receiving General Fund assistance from the Commonwealth..... \$80,819,000
- (2) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only..... 4,768,000
- (3) For operation of dental clinics in the school of dentistry..... 805,000
- (4) For operations of the Titusville Campus..... 640,000
- (5) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students..... 200,000

Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. If necessary, the University of Pittsburgh may transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section 1(1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. (a) Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. (a) The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each branch campus a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs, except for the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to September 1, 1985, shall cover the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1984 and shall include:

(1) The following counts and distributions for each term during the period:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full-time, of faculty members employed part-time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) The total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iii) The number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction scheduled by level of instruction, each further subdivided by two-digit Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) categories of instructional programs of higher education as defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, United States Department of Education.

The term “expenses” also shall include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State medical assistance program.

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**PART III
MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

Section 301. Construction of act.—All appropriations contained in this
act shall be in addition to any sums received pursuant to the act of June 29,
1984 (P.L. 1360, No. 7A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1984.
