HB 1287

Making appropriations from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry to provide for the expenses of administering The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act and The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act for the fiscal year July 1, 1987, to June 30, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1987.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. (a) The sum of \$13,028,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the administration of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act, and the act of June 21, 1939 (P.L.566, No.284), known as The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1987, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1987.

(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the filled complement level of workmen's compensation referees be increased to at least 55 and that sufficient support personnel be provided for the referees so that the time for consideration of contested workmen's compensation cases is reduced and the present backlog of cases are brought to decision.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1987, or immediately, whichever is later.

A SUPPLEMENT

HB 1496

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1987, to June 30, 1988, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses.....	\$142,763,000
(2) For cost of research.....	12,478,000
(3) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only.....	3,970,000
(4) For cost of agricultural research.....	14,851,000
(5) For cost of agricultural extension services.....	16,968,000
(6) For the cost of operating Elizabethtown Hospital....	4,181,000
(7) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students.....	200,000
(8) For technology upgrade.....	1,000,000

Section 2. Payments to The Pennsylvania State University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. If necessary, The Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1(1), (2), (4) and (5): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. (a) Payments to The Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by The Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. Notwithstanding any provision of the General Appropriation Act of 1987 relating to the payment of retirement expenses, the Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University shall make all required payments to the State Employees' Retirement Fund from the funds appropriated pursuant to this act.

Section 6. (a) The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, The Pennsylvania State University shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by The Pennsylvania State University to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 7. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs except the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to September 1, 1988, shall cover the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1987 and shall include:

(1) The following counts and distributions for each term during the period:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full time, of faculty members employed part time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) The total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours, divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iii) The number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction scheduled by level of instruction, each further subdivided by two-digit Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) categories of instructional programs of higher education as defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, United States Department of Education.

(iv) The number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) For the summer term and the following academic year in total and for each two-digit CIP program category, a classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title, including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: teaching and non-teaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time and the following aggregates for each such subdivided classification:

(i) The number of faculty and other professional employees and their full-time equivalence in instructional and noninstructional functions.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate individual instruction courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate individual instruction courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iv) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(v) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(vi) The total salary paid for instructional functions and for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary paid for each of these functions from university funds, Federal funds and other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty member employed full time identified by two-digit CIP program category and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the average hours per week spent in university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

Section 8. In addition to the requirements in section 7 relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1987 shall include for all programs of the university:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 1985, 1986, 1987 and estimated 1988.

Section 9. The Pennsylvania State University shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education shall prescribe.

Section 10. The Pennsylvania State University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance Manual, United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975)" and the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities."

Section 11. This act shall take effect July 1, 1987, or immediately, whichever is later.

To the act of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.87, No.3), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of the University of Pittsburgh," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1987, to June 30, 1988, for the purpose and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses.....	\$97,835,000
(2) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only.....	5,599,000
(3) For operation of dental clinics in the school of dentistry.....	945,000
(4) For operations of the Titusville Campus.....	752,000
(5) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students.....	200,000
(6) For U-PARC.....	2,000,000

Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. If necessary, the University of Pittsburgh may transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section 1(1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. (a) Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. (a) The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each branch campus, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs, except for the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to September 1, 1988, shall cover the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1987 and shall include:

(1) The following counts and distributions for each term during the period:

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of Temple University for the fiscal year July 1, 1987, to June 30, 1988, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses.....	\$107,189,000
(2) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only.....	7,453,000

Section 2. Payments to Temple University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. If necessary, Temple University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1(1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of Lincoln University, Chester County, for the fiscal year July 1, 1987, to June 30, 1988, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

- (1) For educational and general expenses..... \$6,881,000
- (2) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students..... 200,000
- (3) To enhance the opportunity for equal education at Lincoln University in accordance with the plan submitted by the Department of Education and approved by the United States Office of Civil Rights and the appropriation to be managed and supervised by the Department of Education..... 1,000,000

Section 2. Payments to Lincoln University on account of the appropriations for the items provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. (a) Payments to Lincoln University of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by Lincoln University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 4. (a) Lincoln University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates,

Lincoln University shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Lincoln University to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 5. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs. The report, to be submitted prior to September 1, 1988, shall cover the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1987 and shall include:

(1) The following counts and distributions for each term during the period:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full time, of faculty members employed part time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) The total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours, divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iii) The number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction scheduled by level of instruction, each further subdivided by two-digit Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) categories of instructional programs of higher education as defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, United States Department of Education.

(iv) The number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) For the summer term and the following academic year in total and for each two-digit CIP program category, a classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title, including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: teaching and non-teaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time and the following aggregates for each such subdivided classification:

(i) The number of faculty and other professional employees and their full-time equivalence in instructional and noninstructional functions.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate individual instruction courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate individual instruction courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iv) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(v) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(vi) The total salary paid for instructional functions and for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary paid for each of these functions from university funds, Federal funds and other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty member employed full time identified by two-digit CIP program category and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the average hours per week spent in university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

Section 6. In addition to the requirements in section 5 relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1987 shall include for all programs of the university:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 1985, 1986, 1987 and estimated 1988.

Section 7. Lincoln University shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education shall prescribe.

Section 8. Lincoln University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance Manual, United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975)" and the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities."

Section 9. This act shall take effect July 1, 1987, or immediately, whichever is later.
