

CHAPTER CXLIV.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act laying a tax on dogs in certain counties," and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the commissioners of the county of Bucks be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to levy and cause to be collected annually, in the manner provided by the act to which this is a supplement, from every person or persons owning or possessing one dog, any sum not exceeding fifty cents, and for every second dog kept about the same house, any sum not exceeding one dollar and fifty cents, and for every additional dog, any sum not exceeding three dollars.

Dog tax in Bucks county.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be the duty of the commissioners of the city and county of Philadelphia, to levy and cause to be collected annually in addition to the present tax, from every person or persons owning or possessing one dog, twenty-five cents, and for every second dog kept about the same house, fifty cents, and for every additional dog, one dollar, to be applied as is directed in the act to which this is a supplement; and the surplus money arising from the said tax, remaining in the treasury of the said county on the first day of May annually, (after deducting what may probably be wanted before another tax can be collected,) shall be applied by the commissioners of the said county towards a fund for the education of the poor children of the said county, except those within the city of Philadelphia, the township of the Northern Liberties and the district of Southwark.

Surplus money, how to be applied.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the sixth section of the act to which this is a supplement, as applies to the county of Philadelphia, and so much of all other parts of the said act as are hereby altered and supplied, be and the same are hereby repealed.
