## CHAPTER II.

An ACT for the relief of Edmund Milne,

WHEREAS, Edmund Milne hath by his petition fet forth that he paid to John Nicholfon, then comptroller-general, the balance of a judgment obtained against him, which still continues a lien on his property and from which it cannot be relieved, unless an act be passed declaring the said judgment satisfied; and as by the receipt of the said comptroller, it appears that the money was paid by the said Edmund Milne.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the attorney-general cause satisfaction to be entered on record, in the suit instituted in the name of John Hazlewood in behalf of the commonwealth, against Edmund Milne and John Vandeeren.
