CHAPTER XV.

An ACT for the relief of Peter Williams.

THEREAS, it appears by the petition of Peter Williams, formerly a drummer in the third Pennsylvania regiment, that he has lost a certificate, number four hundred and feventy-one, for the fum of eighty-eight pounds one shilling and nine pence, granted him for the depreciation of his pay, and on which one year's interest hath been paid: And whereas, it also appears, by information from the comptroller-general, that the faid certificate hath not been redeemed by this commonwealth: Therefore.

to draw his warrant in fa-Williams for £. 88:1:9 with interest.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is The Governor hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised vour of Peter to draw his warrant upon the state-treasurer, in favor of Peter Williams, for the fum of eighty-eight pounds one shilling and nine pence, together with lawful interest on the said sum, from the first day of July, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-four, until the first day of August, one thousand seven hundred and ninetytwo.
