

CHAPTER XV.

An ACT for the relief of Peter Williams.

WHEREAS, it appears by the petition of Peter Williams, formerly a drummer in the third Pennsylvania regiment, that he has lost a certificate, number four hundred and seventy-one, for the sum of eighty-eight pounds one shilling and nine pence, granted him for the depreciation of his pay, and on which one year's interest hath been paid: And whereas, it also appears, by information from the comptroller-general, that the said certificate hath not been redeemed by this commonwealth: Therefore,

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* the Governor be, and he is hereby authorized to draw his warrant upon the state-treasurer, in favor of Peter Williams, for the sum of eighty-eight pounds one shilling and nine pence, together with lawful interest on the said sum, from the first day of July, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-four, until the first day of August, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two.

The Governor to draw his warrant in favour of Peter Williams for £. 88 : 1 : 9 with interest.
