## CHAPTER XXII.

An ACT to prescribe the times, places and manner, of choosing Senators, to represent this State in the Senate of the United States.

TYPHEREAS, the constitution of the United States declares, that the times, places and manner of holding elections for fenators of the United States, shall be prescribed in each ftate by the legislature thereof: Therefore,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennylvania, in General Affembly met, and it is The legislature hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That tors from this whenever a vacancy is about to take place in flate, to supply the representation from this state, in the senate of the United States, in confequence of the expiration of the time for which a fenator was chosen, the legislature shall proceed to supply fuch vacancy in the following manner, to wit: The

to elect fenavacancies in the fenate of the U.S.

The members of both houses shall assemble in the chamber of the house of representatives, at the hour of twelve, on the fecond Tuesday in December preceding the month of March in any year, wherein a vacancy shall happen by the expiration of the conflitutional term, for which fuch fenator was elected, and then and there elect a fenator or fenators, as the cafe may be, to represent this state in the senate of the United States, which election shall be conduced in the following manner, viz. Before Manner of conthe time of meeting, each house shall appoint election. one teller, and nominate one or more candidate or candidates for fenator, and two days previously to the faid meeting, communicate to each other the names of the persons so by them respectively appointed and nominated: At the meeting, the speaker of the senate, or in his absence, the speaker of the house of reprefentatives shall prefide; the names of the persons voted for, and the members voting, shall be entered in writing by the tellers, who shall report to the prefident the number of votes given for each candidate; if neither of the candidates shall have a majority of votes, of the whole number of the members present, a second poll shall be taken, and fo from time to time, until fome one of the candidates shall have a majority of votes, of the whole number of the members present: If the election shall not have been completed at the first meeting, the president shall adjourn to fuch time as a majority of the members then present shall agree, and so from time to time, until the election shall have been finally whereupon, the prefident shall nounce the person having a majority of votes, of the whole number of members present, to be duly elected a fenator, to represent this state in the senate of the United States: And the pre-

fident shall, in the presence of the members of both houses, sign four several certificates of the election, attested by the tellers; one of which certificates shall be transmitted to the prefident of the fenate of the United States, one to the perfon fo elected, and the remaining two shall be preferved among the records, and entered at length on the journal of the fenate and on the Vacancies hap-journal of the house of representatives: And the ad Tuesday whenever a vacancy, by death, resignation, or in December to otherwise, shall happen in the representation of he filled in like this state, in the fenate of the United States. after the faid fecond Tuesday in December, and during the fession of the legislature; then and in fuch case, the legislature shall, within eight days after knowing or being informed of fuch vacancy, proceed to fill the fame, in the manner
