officer credit the faid purchases respectively, on their final adjustment with this exoneration: Provided always nevertheless, That the aforesaid original settlers or their legal representatives come forward and pay the purchasemoney and remaining interest to the receivergeneral of the land-office, and take out patents for their respective purchases within three years, from and after the passing of this act, otherwise to be excluded from the benefit and provisions therein contained.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That Sandy creek township, Sandy-creek township ditto. in the county aforefaid, shall be a separate election diffrict, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by David Condit, in faid township.

Sec. 4. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That Salem township, in the salem township. county aforesaid, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by John Williamson, in said township.

Sec. 5. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That Pymatuning township Pymatuning and part of and that part of Neshanock township in the Neshanock county aforesaid, which lies north of the do-township ditto. nation land in the third donation district, be a feparate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general election at the house now occupied by Vincent Robbins, in Pymatuning township.

Sec. 6. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the township of Nesha-Residue of Neshanock nock, in the county aforefaid, except that part township ditto. already annexed to Pymatuning township, be a **feparate**

feparate election district, and that the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by James Huston, in said township.
