## CHAPTER XLVI.

An ACT for the relicf of Lewis Garanger.

THEREAS, the commonwealth of Pennfylvania received on loan from Lewis Garanger, a certain certificate of registered debt granted to him by the United States for his fervices in the revolutionary war, and for which the comptroller-general and treasurer of this state, on the first day of April, one thousand feven hundred and eighty-fix, issued two new loan certificates, numbered feven thousand four hundred and fifty-five, and feven thousand four hundred and fifty-fix, in favor of the faid Lewis Garanger, for the fum of feven hundred and thirty-feven pounds twelve shillings and fix-pence, bearing interest from the twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-one, and four years interest have been paid thereon by this state: And whereas the faid certificate of registered debt hath not been re-exchanged for the faid new loan certificates which remain unredeemed: Therefore, Vol. V.
