

CHAPTER XLIX.

An ACT to repeal so much of the act, entitled
 “ A Supplement to the act, entitled “ An Act
 “ to prevent the receiving any more applica-
 “ tions, or issuing any more warrants, except
 “ in certain cases, for lands within this com-
 “ monwealth, passed September the twenty-se-
 “ cond, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-
 “ four, as interferes with the act, entitled “ An
 “ Act directing the sale of certain islands in the
 “ river Susquehanna, passed the sixth of March,
 “ one thousand seven hundred and ninety-three.”

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and
 House of Representatives of the
 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General As-
 sembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the au-
 thority of the same, That so much of the sup-
 plement to the act, entitled “ An Act to prevent
 “ the receiving any more applications, or issuing
 “ any more warrants, except in certain cases, for
 “ land within this commonwealth, passed Sep-
 “ tember the twenty-second, one thousand seven
 “ hundred and ninety-four, as prevents or bars
 “ the issuing any warrant or warrants under the
 “ direction of the act, entitled “ An Act direct-
 “ ing the sale of certain islands in the river Sus-
 “ quehanna, passed the sixth day of March, one
 “ thousand seven hundred and ninety-three;” be,
 and the same is hereby repealed and made void.
