CHAPTER LVIII.

An ACT to erect the town of Beaver, in the county of Beaver, into a borough, and for other purposes.

Section 1. DE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the town of Beaver, county of Bea- in the county of Beaver, shall be, and ver crected in- fame is hereby crected into a borough, which shall be called the borough of Beaver, and the lines of the out-lots of the referve tract of land at the mouth of Big Beaver creek, which have been already fold, and the lines of the tract of five hundred acres of land, appropriated by this commonwealth for the use of a school or academy, in Beaver town, together with the inlots of faid town, shall be the bounds and compole the borough of Beaver.

Borough officers how to be elected.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That it shall and may be lawful for all persons entitled to vote for members of the legislature, who have resided in said borough fix months previously to such election, to meet at the house now occupied by Jonathan Coulter, on the first Monday in May in each year, until a court-house shall be erected, after which the elections shall be held therein, and then and there to elect, by ballot, between the hours of twelve and fix o'clock in the evening. one reputable citizen refiding therein, who shall be styled the burgess of the said borough, and five reputable citizens, to be a town council, and and also shall elect as aforesaid, a high constable, but previously to any such election, the inhabitants shall elect three reputable citizens, one of whom shall preside as judge, one act as inspector, and the other discharge the duty of clerk, according to the general election law of this commonwealth, fo far as relates to receiving and counting the votes, and shall be subject to the same penalties for mal-practices, as by the faid election laws are imposed, and the faid judge, inspector and clerk, before they enter on the duties of their respective offices, shall take an oath or affirmation, before any justice of the peace in the county of Beaver, to perform the fame with fidelity, and shall hold faid elections from time to time, as occasion may require, and receive and count the ballots, and declare the persons having the greatest number of votes, to be duly elected; whereupon duplicate certificates thereof shall be figned by the said judge, inspector and clerk, one of which shall be transmitted to each of the persons elected, and the other filed among the records of the corporation, for their fafe keeping; and in case of vacancy, by death, refignation, refufal to accept, or removal from faid borough, of any of faid officers, the burgefs or in his abfence, or inability to act, the first named of the town council, shall iffue his precept, directed to the high constable, requiring him to hold an election to fill fuch vacancy, he giving at least ten days notice, by advertisements set up at four of the most public places in faid borough.

And be it further enacted by the au-Burges and thority aforesaid, That the burgess and town town council council, duly elected as aforefaid, and their & their successful for smade a fuccessors for ever, shall be one body politic and body corporate corporate in law, by the name of "The bur- & their powers ee gels defined.

" gels and town council of the borough of Bea-"ver, in the county of Beaver," and shall have perpetual fuccession; and the said burgess and town council aforesaid, and their successors for ever, shall be capable in law, to have, get, receive, hold and possess, lands, tenements, rents, liberties, jurisdictions, franchises and hereditaments, to them and their fuccessors, in fee-simple or otherwife, also goods, chattels and other things of what nature and kind foever, not exceeding the yearly value of three thousand dollars, and also to give, grant, let, fell and affign the fame lands, tenements, hereditaments, rents, goods and chattels, and by the name aforefaid, they shall be capable in law, to sue and be fued, plead and be impleaded, in any of the courts of this commonwealth, in all manner of actions whatfoever, and to have and to use one common seal, and the same from time to time, at their will, to change and alter.

Penalty for refusing or neglecking to ferve when elected as a

Sec. 4. And be it further cnacted by the authority aforesaid, That if any person duly elected, whether the burgefs, or a member of the town council, as aforefaid, having been notified boroughollicer, as before directed, shall refuse or neglect to take upon himself the execution of the office to which he shall have been elected, every person fo refusing or neglecting, shall forfeit and pay the fum of twenty dollars, which fine, and all other fines and forfeitures incurred and made payable in pursuance of this act, or of the byelaws and ordinances of the town council, shall be for the use of the said corporation.

Sec. 5. And be it further enacted by the au-Qualifications thority aforefaid, That the burgefs, town counof the horough cil and high constable, and each of them, shall officers. take

take an oath or affirmation, before any justice of the peace of faid county, to support the constitution of the United States and of this state, and well and truly to execute the duties of their respective offices in the borough of Beaver, before they enter on the execution thereof, and the certificate of fuch oath or affirmation, shall be recorded in the books of faid corporation.

Sec. 6. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That it shall and may be Empowered to lawful for the town council to meet as often as affeis taxes, & occasion may require, and enact such bye-laws, to appoint a and make fuch rules, ordinances and regula-townclerk,&c. tions, assess, apportion, and appropriate such taxes as shall be determined by a majority of the town council necessary to promote the peace, good order, benefit or advantage of faid borough, and also to appoint a town clerk, and fuch other officers as may be deemed necessary by a majority of the town council, but no byelaw, rule or ordinance, enacted as aforesaid, shall be repugnant to the constitution or laws of the United States, or of this state, and no perfon shall be punished for the breach of any byelaw or ordinance enacted for the regulation of faid borough of Beaver, unless a true copy thereof, be fet up at three of the most public places in faid borough; and no bye-law or ordinance shall be carried into operation, in less than three weeks after fuch publication: Provided never- Proviso as to theless, That no tax shall be laid in any one year the amount of on the valuation of taxable property, exceeding one cent in the dollar, unless some object of general utility should be thought necessary; in fuch case a majority of the taxable inhabitants of faid borough, by writing, under their hands thall certify the same to the town council,

cil, who shall proceed to affels the same as aforefaid.

Sec. 7. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That the furveyor-general is hereby authorifed and required to cause to be furveyed and laid off, at the expence of faid corporation, in a convenient manner, a part of the faid reserved tract of land, in two separate lots, containing in the whole not more than fifteen acres, on the north fide of the in-lots of faid town of Beaver, fo as to include feveral streams or springs of water that arise in or pass through faid lots, which lots of ground, and the waters thereon, shall be, and they are hereby granted to the inhabitants of faid borough for ever, with full liberty and privilege to carry and conduct the waters from faid freams or Provide in far fprings to any part of faid borough: right of private nevertheless, That the right of private property shall not be in any degree affected or impaired

your of the property.

thereby, without the confent of the owner or owners first obtained for that purpose: provided also, That the faid lots shall not be sold or conveyed by the faid corporation, but remain for the uses aforesaid.

Manner of collecting taxes, fines and forfeitures.

Sec. 8. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That the burgefs, elected agreeably to this act, is hereby authorifed and empowered to iffue his precept, directed to the high conftable, commanding him to collect all taxes affelfed from time to time, as aforefaid, and all fines and forfeitures that may become due by virtue of this act, or by the ordinances or regulations of the corporation, and the same, to pay over to the treasurer to be appointed by the town council, and to carry into effect whatfoever is enjoined on him for the well ordering and governing the faid borough: Provided nevertheless, vertheless. That it shall and may be lawful to and for the justices of the peace residing in or near the faid borough, to do and execute all and every act or acts appertaining to their office, agreeably to the powers conferred on them by the constitution and laws of this commonwealth.

Sec. 9. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the burgess shall be, and Bye-laws, &c. he is hereby required to cause the bye-laws, & carried into rules, ordinances and regulations, made as afore-full effect, and faid, to be recorded in a book to be kept for town clerk and that purpose, and he shall carry the same into high constable. full execution, without delay, after the publication thereof, as directed by this act; and it shall be the duty of the town clerk to attend all meetings of the town council when assembled on business of the corporation, and perform the duty of clerk thereto, and keep and preserve the common feal, records, papers, books and other documents relating to faid corporation, and in default he shall be answerable to any perfon concerned, for all damages, and removed from office by the burgefs, on complaint of a majority of the council; and the high constable shall perform all duties on him enjoined by this act, and also by the bye-laws and ordinances of the town council, under the like penalties. Pro-vided always, That if any person or persons shall ing themselves think him, her or themselves aggrieved by any aggrieved may thing done in pursuance of this act, he, she court of quaror they may appeal to the next court of quar-ter fessions. rer fessions to be held for the proper county, on giving fecurity according to law, to profecute his, her or their appeal with effect, which court shall take such order therein as shall be just and reasonable, which order or judgment

judgment shall be conclusive against all parties.
