judgment shall be conclusive against all parties.

CHAPTER LIX.

A SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled "An "Act to repeal part of an act of the As"sembly of the late Province of Pennsylva"nia, entitled "An Act declaring the river
"Susquehanna and other streams therein men"tioned, public highways, for improving the "navigation of the said river and streams, "and preserving the sigh in the same."

WHEREAS, the legislature, on the twenty-first day of March, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-three, repealed so much of an act, entitled "An Act declaring the river "Susquehanna and other streams therein mentioned, public highways, for improving the navigation of the said river and streams, and preserving the fish in the same," as declares the Raystown branch of Juniata, from the lower end or limits of John Wilt's plantation to the town of Bedford, in the county of Bedford, ford,

ford, to be a public highway, for the purpose of enabling the faid John Wilt to erect certain water-works, which now belong to Peter Arnolt: And whereas doubts have arisen in construing the act to which this is a fupplement: Therefore, to remedy any defect therein contained,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Affembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Peter Arnolt it shall and may be lawful for Peter Arnolt, his erect a millheirs and affigns, and they are hereby autho-dam across rifed and empowered to erect, support, and for Raystown Juever maintain a mill-dam, not exceeding the ninta; height of three feet, across Raystown branch of Juniata, abutting on his own land, in the township of Colerain, in the county of Bedford, and also to lead off from the same on his own land, fo much water of the faid creek, as may be found necessary for his water-works already erected, or that may be erected on the fouth but the navigabank of the faid river: Provided always, That but the navigation of the rithe faid Peter Arnolt, his heirs and affigns in ver or the proerecting the faid dam, or in keeping the fame perty of indiin repair, shall always construct the same with a be injured platform or flope, so as not to injure the navi-thereby. gation of faid river, or the property of individuals, and in fuch manner as that boats and rafts may fafely pass over the faid slope: And provided always, That the faid dam be fo constructed as not to prevent the passage of fish up the faid stream.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That the faid Peter Arnolt, Conditions anhis heirs and assigns, shall for ever maintain and privilege. keep in good order, on the body of the faid, dam, in a convenient part of the same, for rafts

to pass over, a complete slope of twenty-five feet in breadth, extending one rod down stream for every foot the dam shall be raised in height, and shall build the dam one foot higher at each side, to convey the water into the slope; and shall also construct the slope one foot and an half higher at each side thereof, to keep the water thereon, until it meets the level of the bottom of the river, for the passage of boats and rasts as aforesaid.

How persons aggrieved may obtain redress.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That on the complaint of any person or persons, to the judges of the court of quarter fessions of the said county, it shall and may be lawful for the said judges, to appoint three commissioners to view the faid dam, and to compare it with the limitations and provisions herein fee forth and enacted, and report to them, at their next sessions, in the said county, the state thereof, which report, on oath or affirmation, if it contain a statement of facts constituting an offence against this act, shall be fufficient ground for the court to direct a bill of indictment to be fent to the grand jury, and upon profecution to conviction, the faid Peter Arnolt, his heirs or affigns, shall be liable to pay a fine, not exceeding two hundred dollars, at the discretion of the court; and the court shall adjudge so much of the said dam to be abated and altered as shall bring the same within the limitations and provisions of this act.
