CHAPTER LXXVI.

An ACT to empower the Trustees of Crawford county, to erect a suitable building for a Semi-nary of Learning in the town of Meadville.

Section 1. DE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That David Meade, James Trustees of a Gibson, Roger Alden, Joseph Stockton, Tho-learning at mas R. Kennedy, Samuel Dale, junior, and Meadville, ap-Patrick M'Gill, be, and they are hereby con-pointed with powers to reflituted and appointed trustees for a public se-ceive grants of minary of learning, to be erected in the town fonal property of Meadville, in Crawford county, and that for the use they, or a majority of them, be, and they are sue fue for and rehereby empowered to take and receive all and cover the debts every grant or grants of land, or any other due to the estate, real or personal, which have or may be made, granted or given to them, or to the former trustees, for the use of said seminary, and to take to themselves, in fee-simple, or otherwife, any conveyance or affurance, in trust for the same, and to ask, demand, and to sue for and recover all fuch fum or fums of money. as may have at any time been, or may be hereafter fubscribed to and for said seminary of learning.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said trustees, and Before enterevery of them, shall, before they enter on the ing on the duduties of their office, give bond, with two fuf-office to give ficient fureties, for the use of said seminary, to bond, &c. the commissioners of the county, and their fuc-

ceffors.

ceffors, in the fum of fix hundred dollars each, for the faithful performance of the duties enjoined on them by this act.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted by the au-Empowered to thority aforesaid, That the said trustees, or a purchase a lor, majority of them, shall take to themselves, in fee-simple, any affurance or conveyance of a teacher for the lot or piece of ground, in trust, for the use of faid feminary, and thereon shall erect or cause to be erected, a fuitable house for such public feminary, provided the expence of erecting the fame, do not exceed the fum of fix hundred dollars; and shall employ a teacher or teachers for faid feminary, and shall pay him or them any fum or fums not exceeding the yearly interest arising from the funds of said institution.

To place the public monics in fome productive fund & to exhibit grand jury.

Sec. 4. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That the faid trustees shall, from time to time, lay out or place in some productive fund, fuch fum or fums of money their accounts as they shall from time to time receive in purannually to the fuance of this act; and the faid trustees shall, once in every year, exhibit their accounts to the grand jury of the county for their inspection and approbation.
