## CHAPTER LXXXIV.

An ACT to provide for the distribution of the Lows and Fournals, of the General Affembly of this Commonwealth.

Section 1. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the Secretary of the How said law are to be difcommonwealth shall cause the said copies of the tributed. laws to be distributed in the following manner, to wit: Thirty copies thereof to the clerk of the fenate, for the use of the senate and the members thereof respectively; one hundred copies to the clerk of the house of representatives, for the use of the house and the members thereof respectively; and shall distribute the residue in manner following: To the prothonotary of the fupreme court fix copies, one thereof for each of the judges, one for the attorney-general, and one for himfelf; to the Governor one, and retain one for the Secretary's own use; to the secretary of the land-office, furveyor-general and receiver-

receiver-general, each one copy; to the comptroller-general, register-general, state treasurer, and master of the rolls, one copy each; to the clerk of the mayor's court of the city of Philadelphia, forty copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Philadelphia, fixty copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Bucks, eightyfive copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Chester, ninety-five copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Lancaster, ninety-five copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Northampton, ninety copies; to the prothonotary of the county of York, feventy copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Cumberland, feventy-five copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Berks, ninety-five copies, to the prothonotary of the county of Bedford, fifty copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Northumberland, one hundred copies; to the prothonotary of the counties of Westmoreland and Armstrong, ninety copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Washington, one hundred copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Fayette, fixty copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Franklin, fixty copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Montgomery, eighty copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Dauphin, fixty-five copies; to the prothonotary of county of Luzerne, fixty-five copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Huntingdon, fixty copies; to the prothonotary of Allegheny, including the counties of Beaver and Butler, one hundred copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Mifflin, fifty-five copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Delaware, fifty-five copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Lycoming, fixty copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Somerset, forty-five copies; to the prothonotary of the county of Greene, forty-five

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the printers of the jour- When the ournals of the senate and house of representatives, nals are to be shall deliver the said journals into the office of the secretary's the Secretary of this commonwealth, on or office, and of their distribubefore the first day of June annually; and the tion. faid Secretary is hereby authorised and directed, after delivering to the clerks of the fenate and house of representatives, a sufficient number of copies of the laws and journals, for the use of their respective houses and the members thereof, and alfo to the respective officers residing at the seat of government, to cause the remainder of the laws, agreeably to the proportion mentioned in the fecond fection of this act, and the journals in proportion to the number of representatives each county may have in the legislature of this commonwealth, to be within one month after they have been delivered into his office, transmitted at the expence of the state, to the refpective prothonotaries within the same, to be paid out of the funds appropriated for the support of government.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That the prothonotaries of Of the duties the respective counties, on receipt of the laws of the prothoand journals annually, shall as foon as may be, several countries give notice thereof, in a newspaper printed within the laws and such county, or where there is no such paper printipumals. ted within fuch county, by advertisements post-

ed up in different parts of the county, purports ing that the laws and journals of the last session are ready to be delivered out by them, to the persons entitled to receive the same, agreeably to the provisions of this act; and the expence of publishing or advertising as aforesaid, shall be paid on orders drawn by the commissioners on the treasurer of such county, out of the county ftock.

Sec. 5. And he it further enacted by the au-How they are thority aforesaid, That the prothonotaries of the respective counties shall distribute the laws and journals in the following manner and order, viz. One copy of each for himself and for the clerks of the different courts if the offices are divided; one to the register and recorder, if said offices are divided; one to the prefident and one to each of the affociate justices of the court; one to the board of commissioners; and one copy of each to be delivered by fuch prothonotary, to each constable of the respective wards or townships for which such constable was elected or appointed, to be by fuch constable delivered into the hands of the perion occupying the house where the township elections for the choice of constables are held; and it shall be the duty of fuch confrable annually, under the penalty of five dollars for every neglect or refulal, to procure and lodge the faid copies of the laws and journals at fuch place of holding the elections as aforefaid, which laws and journals shall be kept at fuch house for the free inspection of every inhabitant, at all feafonable times, within such ward or township; and one copy of such laws and journals, if any journals be left after the aforcfaid distribution, shall on application, be delivered to each justice of the peace, sheriff, county commissioner, treasurer, deputy surveyor and brigade gade inspector, and to each associated library company; and the remainder, if any, shall be retained by such prothonotary, to supply deficiencies in any of the aforesaid offices: Provided, That the faid prothonotaries respectively, shall not deliver any of faid laws or journals without taking a receipt therefor, enjoining each officer receiving the lame, to deliver them over to his fuccessor, and such receipt shall be entered in a book by them prepared, at the expence of their respective counties.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That the act, entitled " An Repealing "Act providing for the distribution of the jour-clause. of the fenate and of the house of repre-" fentatives of this commonwealth," passed the ninth day of April, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, and fo much of any other act or acts of the general affembly, relating to the printing or distributing of the laws or journals of this commonwealth, as are hereby amended altered or supplied, be, and the same are hereby repealed.
