CHAPTER LXXXV.

An ACT for laying out, making and keeping in repair, the public roads and highways within this Commonwealth, and for laying out private roads.

WHEREAS, the existing road law, which was passed the twenty-first day of March in the year one thousand seven hundred and feventy-two, directs that the road tax shall be levied on the clear yearly value of the property thereby made taxable, according to the estimate thereof made for the last county tax, assessed and levied in pursuance of an act for raising county rates and levies, passed the twentieth day of March, one thousand seven hundred and twentyfour and twenty-five: And whereas the act for raifing county rates and levies, passed on the eleventh day of April, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, establishes a mode of asfessing county rates and levies different from that of the act last aforesaid, by which means it hath happened that supervisors cannot lawfully affels and collect taxes adequate to laying out, improving and repairing the public roads or highways: Wherefore,

Section 1. Penalty for committing nuisances on the highways,

Sec. 15. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That if any person or perfons shall stop or obstruct any of the public roads or highways laid out agreeably to law, or shall commit any nuisance thereon, by felling trees, making fences, or by turning the road, or by any other way whereby the road or highway may fuster damage, and do not, on notice given by the fupervisor of the proper township, remove the nuisance or repair the damage forthwith, fuch person or persons shall for every fuch offence, be fined in a fum not exceeding forty dollars, nor less than ten dollars, as the cafe may require, to be recovered before one of the nearest justices of the peace of the proper county, and to be applied to the removing of the faid nuisances, or repairing the injury or damage which the road or highway may have fo fustained, and the furplus (if any) to be applied to the repair of the roads in the respective townships: Provided always, That the same appeal shall be allowed to any person or persons fined as aforesaid, as is provided by the twelfth section of this act.

Sec. 18. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That if the owners of the improved land through which any fuch private road is laid out, or the owners of other land through which it is carried, are defirous to hang a fwinging gate or gates upon fuch roads as are only granted for the use of one or more private families, it shall and may be lawful for the aforefaid court, on application, by petition to them made, to appoint fix perfons, in the manner herein before directed for laying out roads, to enquire and judge whether fuch gate or gates may without much inconveniency to the persons for whose use the road was granted, be hung on the same, and if the persons appointed to view the place, or any four of them, shall certify to the justices of the court aforesaid, that a gate or gates may be hung according to the prayer of the party, without much inconveniency to the person or persons using the road, the justices shall order that a gate or gates may be hung thereon accordingly, and that the fame shall be made and kept in repair by the owner of the faid land, and made easy for the passage of persons using the faid road.

Sec. 19. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the feveral courts quarter fessions, in their respective counties, shall may be deem- have authority, upon application, by petition to them made, to enquire of and to vacate any priĿ

vate or public road or highway, or any part of fuch road or highway which they shall judge to be useless, inconvenient and burthensome, and the faid court shall proceed therein by views thereof, in like manner as they are authorised to do, and as is usually practised in laying our of public roads and highways; and the judgment of the court of quarter fessions shall be effectual and conclusive in the premiles, if the same be not appealed from within fix months from and after the giving of such judgment; the application aforefaid shall be made in writing, figned by the persons applying, and shall set forth in a clear and intelligible manner, the length, breadth, fituation, and other circumstances of such road or highway, or of the part thereof which those applying defire to have laid afide and vacated as aforefaid, and fuch application shall be audibly read twice in open fessions, on the different days of the fessions whereat it was made; and no other or furher proceeding shall be had thereon, but the same shall be adjourned till the next court of quarter fessions, when the same shall again be openly and audibly read twice, on feveral days, before the court proceed thereon: Provided always, That nothing in this act shall Exception as be understood to give authority to any of the &c. within any faid courts of quarter fessions, or to the supreme corporate town court, to vacate any lane, street or highway that may be within the city of Philadelphia, or within any claimed as priborough, town plot, or any town or village in this state, which hath been laid out by the late proprietaries, or by any other person or persons, and dedicated to public use, nor to vacate any cart-way laid out by order of court, nor any road or paffage claimed by any person as his or her private right, and which cart-way, road-way or paffage, is not repairable at the charge of the townthip or district, nor to rivers or streams of water.

Sec. 20. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall be the duty of the supervisors, and they are hereby enjoined and required, in making and repairing the public roads or highways, to make and maintain fufficient causeways, of stone or timber, on marshy or swampy grounds, and also make and maintain fufficient bridges over all small creeks and rivulets and deep gullies, where the fame shall be necessary for the ease and safety of travellers; and where a fmall creek, over which a bridge may be necessary, happens to be a boundary or division line of two townships, the bridge shall be built and maintained by the fupervisors of both townships respectively, at the equal expence of the faid townships, in the fame manner as is directed by this act with refpect to the making and repairing of public roads and highways which may be the division line of townships.

Sec. 21. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That where a river, creek or rivulet, over which it is necessary to erect a bridge, croffes a public road or highway, and the erecting of fuch bridge requires more expence than it is reasonable that one township, or two adjoining townships should bear, it shall be the duty of the justices of the court of quarter fessions, and they are hereby enjoined and required, on the reprefentation of the supervisor or fupervifors, or on the petition and at the request of a number of the inhabitants of the respective townships, to order a view, in the same manner as in the case of laying out roads and highways; and if on the report of the faid view, it appears to the court, grand jury, and commissioners, that such a bridge is necessary, and would be too expensive for the township or townships townships to erect, it shall be entered on record, and it shall be the duty of the commissioners of the county to procure an estimate, as nearly as may be, of the money which will be necessary to erect fuch bridge, and the commissioners of the county shall provide the same out of the county taxes, and proceed forthwith to have fuch bridge erected, by contract or otherwise, as shall seem to them most expedient; and such bridge, when so erected, shall be inspected by fix fit persons, appointed by the justices of the court of quarter fessions, agreeably to whose report it shall be approved or disapproved by the court, and if approved, the money shall be paid agreeably to contract, or damages in favor of the county awarded, according to the judgment of the court.

Sec. 22. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That in all cases wherein the Reviews of court of quarter sessions is authorised to grant a ges to be view for the purpose of laying out or vacating granted, but roads, or respecting bridges, the justices of the plied for withcourt of quarter sessions are hereby authorised in a limited and directed, on application to them made for that purpose, to grant a re-view of the same, at the expence of the parties applying: Provided, That application is made therefor at the next court of quarter sessions after report has been made on the first view.

Sec. 23. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the township affessor Compensation, shall receive from the supervisors, any sum not of township attended one dollar, for every day he shall be visors and road necessarily employed in affessing the tax directed viewers. by this act, and that the supervisors shall be allowed in the settlement of their accounts, any Vol. V. 2 C fum

fum not exceeding one dollar respectively, for every day they shall be necessarily employed in discharging the duties of their office, except for collecting the road tax, for which they shall be allowed the amount of five cents out of every dollar they shall so collect or cause to be collected, and no more; and the freeholders or other inhabitants who shall be directed to view public roads or highways, shall each of them, for every day they are necessarily employed in that fervice, receive from the county treasurer one dollar, on producing a certificate from the clerk of the court of quarter fellions, that fuch fervice was performed by them; the furveyor shall be found and paid by the perfons applying for the view; and the expence of views of private roads, and of re-views of private or public roads, shall be wholly paid by the parties applying for the fame.

Sec. 24. And be it further enacted by the au-Direction posts thority aforefaid, That the supervisors within to be erected the respective townships, shall cause posts to be where cross roads interfed erected, where trees are not convenient, at the the highways, interfection of all public roads, with boards and an index-hand pointing to the direction of fuch road on both fides whereof shall be inscribed, in legible characters, the name of the town, village or place to which fuch road leads, and the diftance thereof in computed miles; and any perfon or perfons who shall wilfully injure, deface or destroy any such posts or index-boards, the person or persons so offending, shall on conviction thereof, before any justice of the peace of the proper county, forfeit and pay any fum not exceeding ten dollars, one half thereof to be paid to the informer or informers, and the other half to the supervisors of the respective town-

ships

ships wherein the offence shall be committed, to be appropriated to the repairs of the roads in such townships.

Sec. 25. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That all laws heretofore enacted for the laying out, opening, making, than those recamending or repairing of public or private roads pecting turnor highways, or for the making and repairing &c. repealed. of bridges, other than turnpike roads and streets, roads, lanes, alleys and bridges, in the city of Philadelphia and other corporate towns, are hereby repealed and made void: Provided always, That nothing herein contained, shall be so construed as to interfere with any special provision heretofore made by law, respecting the county of Philadelphia.
