

CHAPTER XCVIII.

An ACT to erect Milford township, in the county of Somerset, into a separate election district.

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act, the township of Milford, in Somerset county, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by John Gephart in Milford township aforesaid, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

The township of Milford, Somerset county, to be an election district, and elections to be held at the house of John Gephart.

CHAPTER XCIX.

A SUPPLEMENT to the act, entitled " An act, to erect the town of Lebanon, in the county of Dauphin, into a borough."

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly

sembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act, similar rights, privileges and immunities, as are now exercised holden and enjoyed by the burgesses, freeholders and inhabitants of the borough of Reading, in and by the ninth section of the act, establishing the said borough, shall and may from henceforth be exercised holden and enjoyed by the burgesses, freeholders and inhabitants of the borough of Lebanon, in the county of Dauphin, and the yearly fairs in the said borough of Lebanon, shall commence on the fourth Thursday, in the month of May, and on the fourth Monday in the month of October, in each and every year.

The privilege of holding fairs granted to the burgesses &c. of the borough of Lebanon, and times of holding them.
