CHAPTER CXL

An ACT to raise by way of lottery, a sum of money to defray the expence of rebuilding a church in the borough of York.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Section 1. Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Godfiey Lenhart, sum that may Andrew Robinson, John Ernst, Peter Small, Daniel Spangler, John Rothrock, George Barnitz and Christopher Lowman, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to raise by way of lottery, a sum of money not exceeding twenty-four hundred dollars, with a discount of twenty per cent. to be by them applied to the payment of a debt, incurred by the German Presbyterian congregation, of the borough and county of York, in rebuilding their house of worship, which was lately destroyed by accidental fire.
