the Governor of this commonwealth, who shall thereupon forthwith nominate and appoint three disinterested and skilful persons to view and examine the same, and report to him in writing whether the same is so far executed in a masterly and workman-like manner, according to the true intent and meaning of the act to which this is a supplement; and if their report shall in any such case be in the affirmative, then the Governor shall by licence under his hand, and the lesser seal of the commonwealth, permit and suffer the said president, managers and company, to erect and fix so many gates and turnpikes upon and across the said road, as will be necessary and sufficient to enable them to take and collect the tolls and duties, in the said act mentioned, according to the rates therein specified and set forth.

## CHAPTER CXV.

An ACT to enable the Governor of this Commonwealth, to incorporate a company for making an artificial road by the best and nearest route, from the borough of Easton, in the county of Northampton, to the town of Wilkesbarre, in the county of Luzerne.

WHEREAS the general assembly has been petitioned to pass an act, for the incorporation of a company to make a turnpike road, from Easton, in the county of Northampton, to Wilkesbarre, in the county of Luzerne, and it is reasonable and proper to give encouragement to such associations, of individuals as are intended for the public benefit, by facilitating the communication between the different parts of the state.
