Sec. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That on complaint made to the judges of the court of quarter sessions of ces against the the county aforesaid, they shall appoint three commissioners, to view the said dam, and compare it with the provisions of this act, and to report to them at their next session, the state thereof, which report if it contains an offence against this act, the court shall direct a bill of indictment, to be sent to the grand jury, and upon prosecution to conviction, the said William Wright, his heirs or assigns, shall be liable to pay a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars, at the discretion of the court, who shall order so much of said dam, to be thrown down as will bring the same within the limitations and provisions of this act, at the expence of the person convicted.
