

CHAPTER CXVII.

An ACT to authorise Samuel Bell and Nicholas Gerst, their heirs and assigns respectively, to erect mill-dams on Swatara creek, in the county of Dauphin.

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for Samuel Bell, his heirs and assigns, to erect, support and for ever maintain a mill-dam across Swatara creek, adjoining his own land, and with the consent and approbation of the owner of the land on the opposite side of the said creek, of such convenient height as he or they may think necessary, for the purpose of drawing off thereby so much of the water out of the said creek, as may be necessary for his mill and other water-works: *Provided*, That he or they shall erect a good and sufficient lock, and keep the same in good order and repair for the free passage of boats, and such slope as may admit the passage of fish without interruption over the said dam, and also, that the rights of individuals shall be preserved.

Samuel Bell, his heirs &c. authorised to erect a mill-dam across Swatara creek &c.

But the passage of boats and fish not to be interrupted or the rights of individuals impaired thereby.

Sec. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That it shall and may be lawful for Nicholas Gerst, his heirs and assigns, to erect, support and for ever maintain, a mill-dam across Swatara creek, opposite to his or their own land, with the consent and approbation of the owner of the land on the opposite side of the said creek, of such convenient height as may be necessary for the purpose of drawing

A similar privilege granted to Nicholas Gerst, with the like proviso.

drawing off thereby so much of the water out of the said creek, as may be necessary for his mill and other water-works: *Provided*, He or they shall make a good and sufficient lock, for the free passage of boats, and keep the same in good order and repair, and such slope as may admit the passage of fish without interruption over the said dam, and also that the rights of all and every individual shall not be injured or infringed, by any of the privileges granted by this act.

CHAPTER CXVIII.

An ACT for settling the accounts of the trustees of Wayne county, and vesting the powers of said trustees in the county commissioners.

Section 1. **BE** it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the commissioners of Wayne county, shall on or before the first day of June next, settle and adjust the accounts of the trustees of said county, and pay out of the county stock, such sum or sums of money, as they may find due to the said trustees, or
