Be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the operation of the fifth section of an act, entitled "An act for "the regulation of the militia of the common-"wealth of Pennsylvania," passed April sixth, one thousand eight hundred and two, shall be suspended for three years, so far as relates to the uniform of companies who had uniformed themselves previous to the passing of said act, unless called into actual service before the expiration thereof.
