#### CHAPTER CLIV.

*An ACT to enable Martin Hocker, to obtain a title to a lot of land in the township of Paxton, and county of Dauphin.*

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the legislature, that Martin Hocker, did purchase of his brother John Hocker, a lot of land, containing about ten acres, situate in the township of Paxton, in the county of Dauphin, and hath actually paid the full consideration for the same, according to the terms of an agreement made in the life time of the said John Hocker, who is since dead, by reason whereof he is deprived of the means of obtaining a title thereto, and as no written contract was made respecting the premises, he therefore prays the legislature to authorise the administrators of the said John Hocker, to execute a deed to him the said Martin Hocker, his heirs and assigns: And whereas, the said representation appears to be true, it is just and reasonable

reasonable that the prayer of the petitioner ought to be granted: Therefore,

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the administrators of the said John Hocker, deceased, be, and they are hereby authorised on behalf of the heirs, of the said deceased, to convey to the said Martin Hocker, his heirs and assigns, the lot of land aforesaid, agreeably to the butts, boundaries and terms of the agreement aforesaid.

The representatives of John Hocker, deceased, empowered to convey in fee simple to Martin Hocker, a lot of land situate in Paxton township, Dauphin county.
