CHAPTER CLXXXV.

An ACT to empower the overseers and guardians of the poor of the several townships within this Commonwealth, to recover certain fines, penalties and forfeitures, and for other purposes.

HEREAS certain fines, penalties and forreitures are by divers acts of assembly, directed to be paid to justices of the peace for the use of the poor: And whereas the means by law provided for recovering the same from the said justices, are defective and inadequate: For remedy whereof,

And whereas the fine imposed by law on persons who refuse to serve the office of constable, is now paid into the hands of the sheriff of the proper county, but no provision is made in what manner, and to what purpose such fines shall be appropriated: Be it therefore enacted by the authority aforesaid. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That all and singular the The foregoing provisions of this act, respecting the dispo-provisions extended to the sal of any fines and forfeitures incurred un-city of Philader the laws of this commonwealth, and now delphia and its suburbs. are or hereafter may be in the hands of any justice of the peace, or sheriff of any county within the state, shall be extended to, and be binding on the mayor, alderman and alderman's court of the city of Philadelphia, and the justices of the peace of the township of the Northern Liberties and the district of Southwark; and all fines and forfeitures that have been, or hereafter may be received by the mayor, aldermen, alderman's court and justices of the peace as aforesaid, shall be paid to the guardians of the poor for the

city of Philadelphia, the township of the Northern Liberties and the district of Southwark aforesaid, and the constables of the city. township and district aforesaid, shall perform the like services, and be entitled to the like compensations, as the constables of any township within this state are entitled to, for services rendered agreeably to the requisitions of this act, and the mayor, aldermen and alderman's court of the city of Philadelphia, and the justices of the peace of the township of the Northern Liberties and district of Southwark, shall annually at the settlement of the accounts of the guardians of the poor of said city, township and district, by the auditors appointed for the purpose, exhibit their respective dockets, if required, for the inspection of the said auditors for settlement.
