

## CHAPTER XXXIII.

*A SUPPLEMENT to an act for establishing a nightly watch, providing lamps and supporting pumps for public use in the borough of Lancaster, in the county of Lancaster, passed the fourth day of April one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two.*

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act it shall be the duty of the assessors and wardens of the borough of Lancaster, in laying taxes under the authority of the act to which this is a supplement, to lay and apportion the same according to the best of their skill and judgment, as near to and in proportion with the last county rates and levies as may be; and so much of the third section of the act, to which this is a supplement, as requires the taking of an assessment for the purpose of laying such tax, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

How taxes within the borough of Lancaster are to be apportioned.
