Sec. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the said commissioners be and they are hereby authorized to settle and adjust all accounts which may be exhibited by any person or persons, legally employed in carrying this act into effect; and that all expences necessarily attending the same, shall be paid by the aforesaid commissioners out of the net proceeds of the said lottery.

Prizes not demanded within 12 months after drawing, forfeited. Sec. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That all prizes not demanded within twelve months next after publication as aforesaid, shall be considered as relinquished for the benefit of the said church.

An ACT to erect a new election district in the county of Franklin.

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly

CHAPTER LXIII.

An ACT enjoining certain duties on the surveyor-general.

WHEREAS it is frequently necessary, on the trial of ejectments within this commonwealth, to ascertain the time of the return of any survey or surveys into the surveyor-general's office, by his deputies, and which, in many cases, can only be known by entries of the
