CHAPTER CXIX.

*An ACT erecting certain Election Districts, and making alterations in other districts, in certain counties within this Commonwealth.*

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That until another public school-house shall be erected in Mifflin-town, the electors of Fermanagh and Milford townships, in the county of Mifflin, shall hold their elections in the school-house now occupied by David Steele, in Mifflin-town afore said.

Place of elections in Fermanagh and Milford townships, Mifflin county.

Sec. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority afore said, That the electors residing within the district of Cumberland-valley town-ship,*

In Cumberland valley town-ship, county of Bedford.

ship, in the county of Bedford, shall, from and after the passing of this act, hold their elections at the house now occupied by John M<sup>c</sup>-Coy, in the township of Cumberland-valley aforesaid, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

**Part of West-caln township, in Chester county, annexed to the eighth election district.**

Sec. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all that part of West-caln township, in the county of Chester, that lies north of what is called Culbertson's road, to where it intersects the old Lancaster road, be and the same is hereby annexed to the eighth election district in the said county, and the electors residing within the said part of West-caln township, shall vote at the place appointed by law within the said district to which they are annexed.

**A new election district erected in Indiana county, and place of elections.**

Sec. 4. *And it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act, that part of the township of Armstrong, in the county of Indiana, which lies north of the following lines, *to wit*: Beginning at the north-west boundary line of said township, near to and including James M<sup>c</sup>-Clanahan's farm, on Crooked creek; thence a straight line to the south-east boundary line of said township, and including the dwelling house of Adam Pilson, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their elections at the house now occupied by Jacob Haas, of said district.

**North Irwin district, in Venango county, erected.**

Sec. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act, the following described part of Venango county, shall be a separate election district, *to wit*: Beginning on the verge of Allegheny

legheny river, where the line dividing the counties of Warren and Venango crosses the same; thence down the said river to the mouth of Oil creek; thence up Oil creek to the place where a line extending south from the west end of a tract of land, surveyed in the name of Andrew Cress, or Carlson, crosses the same; thence north to the line dividing the counties of Crawford and Warren from the county of Venango; thence east along the said line to the place of beginning, and the electors thereof shall hold their elections at the house now occupied by Thomas Gott, and hereafter to be known by the name of North Irwin district.

Sec. 6. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act the township of Londonderry, in the county of Dauphin, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their elections at the house now occupied by Robert Davidson, in Palmstown, in the said township.

Londonderry township, in the county of Dauphin, to be a separate election district.

Sec. 7. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act the township of Toby, in the county of Armstrong, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Abraham Standford, in said township, any law or laws to the contrary notwithstanding.

Place of election in Toby township, Armstrong county.

Sec. 8. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the township of Tioga, in the county of Lycoming, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall

In Tioga township, Lycoming county.

shall hold their elections at the house now occupied by Thomas Berry, in said township.

In Moon township, Allegheny county.

Sec. 9. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act the electors of Moon township, in Allegheny county, shall hold their elections at the house now occupied by John Bryan, sen. in said township.

Robinson township, Allegheny county, erected in to a separate election district.

Sec. 10. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act Robinson township, in Allegheny county, shall be erected into a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their elections at the house now occupied by William Marks, in said township.

The fifth district, in Butler county, erected.

Sec. 11. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act the fifth district, in Butler county, shall be erected into a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their elections at the house now occupied by Alexander Ramsay, in said district.

Middlesex and part of Buffalo township, in said county, made a new election district.

Sec. 12. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act the township of Middlesex, and that part of Buffalo township annexed to Middlesex township, in Butler county, shall be erected into a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their elections at the house now occupied by John Neighley, in the town of Butler.

The second district in said county, erected.

Sec. 13. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act the second district, in Butler county,

county, shall be erected into a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their elections at the house now occupied by Alexander Ramsay, in said district.

Sec. 14. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act the sixth district, in Butler county, shall be erected into a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their elections at the house now occupied by Washington Porter, in said district.

The sixth district erected.

## CHAPTER CXX.

*A SUPPLEMENT to the act, entitled, An act for laying out and keeping in repair the public Highways within this Commonwealth, and for laying out private Roads.*
