State line; thence north along faid line to Buffaloe creek; thence up faid creek to the mouth of Buck-run; thence along the line that divides Buffaloe and Donegal townships to Findley township; thence along the line that divides Findley and Buffaloe townships to Morris township; thence along the line that divides Morris and Findley townships to the place of beginning; and the electors of the faid district shall hold their general elections at the house formerly appointed by law.

## CHAPTER IV.

A SUPPLEMENT to the Act, entitled, "An Act to incorporate the Philadelphia Bank."
