

CHAPTER CLXIV.

An ACT to invest two lots and one half lot of ground, in the minister, church wardens and vestry men, of Trinity Church, in Pittsburg.

WHEREAS it hath been represented by the minister, church wardens and vestry men of Trinity Church, in Pittsburg, that the honourable John Penn, junior, and John Penn, esquires by indenture bearing date the twenty-fourth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven, did grant and convey two contiguous lots of ground situate in the town of Pittsburg, and marked in the general plan thereof, number four hundred and thirty-five, and four hundred and thirty-six, and one half lot of ground adjoining the same, and marked in the same plan, number four hundred and thirty seven, bounded by Sixth-street, by lot number four hundred and thirty-four, by Virgin-alley, and by the remaining moiety of lot, number four hundred and thirty-seven, to the honourable John Gibson, esquire, John Ormsby, merchant, Devereaux Smith, gentleman, and doctor Nathaniel Bedford, and their heirs and assigns, in trust for and as a scite for a house of religious worship and a burial ground, for the religious society or congregation of the Protestant Episcopal Church, and their successors in the town of Pittsburg and the vicinity thereof, and that the said congregation have lately been incorporated by the name, style and title of "The minister, church wardens and vestry men, of Trinity Church in Pittsburg;" wherefore they pray that the said two lots and half lot of ground aforesaid, may be vested in the said corporation: Therefore,

Sec. 1.

The title to two lots and an half of ground, confirmed to the minister &c. of Trinity Church in Pittsburg.

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the title to the said two lots of ground, number four hundred and thirty-five, and number four hundred and thirty-six, and the said half lot of ground, number four hundred and thirty-seven, situate in the borough of Pittsburg, as the same two lots and half lot are mentioned, bounded and described in the indenture afore said, (recorded in the office for recording of deeds in and for the county of Westmoreland, the twenty-seventeenth of March, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-eight), be, and the same is hereby invested in and confirmed to "The minister, church wardens and vestry men, of Trinity Church in Pittsburg," and their successors for ever, to remain unalienable for and as a burial ground for the said congregation.
